SUBJ: INFORMATION CONCERNING T/O

1. The Water Treatment Section is presently short (2) WG-9 operators and (1) WS-10 Foreman position. One WG-9 billet was transferred to the sewage plant in anticipation of combining the water treatment plants at Holcomb Boulevard, Tarawa Terrace, and Camp Johnson. Due to operational problems with the new Holcomb Boulevard equipment, this start-up has not occurred. We are presently using a relief operator to continue to fill this billet. The other billet was caused by a Water Plant Operator retiring, Mr. Leon Parker. We are presently filling this operator vacancy with a relief operator.
2. We are presently using the WL-9 Leader on a rotation basis to fill in for the foreman position. This requires another Water Treatment Plant Operator to fill in for the leader.
3. We are using three (3) WG-7 operators for the three relief operators. When the WG-7 operators are not on the well route, wells and pools are going unchecked. We also are approaching the start-up of the summer pools (Paradise Point, Tarawa Terrace, Marine Corps Air Station Officer and Enlisted Pools). We do not feel leaving the wells and pools unchecked for any length of time is advisable, therefore we have been using two (2) WG-5's to fill in temporarily. We do not want to continue working them in this capacity. We were also using the two (2) temporary employees to fill in for the WG-5's when they were on the well route. As you know, the temporaries have been rifted.
4. The Water Treatment Section cannot continue operating under these conditions without making changes in our Standard Operating Procedures. These changes would need upper management consideration and approval.
