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



1. Reference (a) requested helicopter support for deployment of a 1000-gallon water bucket as a wildfire suppression tool. Enclosure (1) to reference (b) represents working procedures presently in use.

The base wildfire suppression capability has been greatly enhanced by this unique fire fighting tool and there are beneficial pilot training aspects associated with the operation.
3. As the cooperative effort has proven mutually beneficial, it should represent a long term commitment; hence, it is felt that a more formal arrangement is indicated. Enclosure (1) is provided for your review/ comments and signature, if agreeable.





(4) If radio contact cannot be established, the pilot will make 45° angle drops across the head of the fire.

(5) Pilot will inform Natural Resources of maintenance needs to the helicopter bucket, phone 451-2195/2083.

3. Tenure of Agreement. This agreement is effective upon signature and will continue in effect until operational commitments preclude continuation. In the event this should occur the Commanding General, Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina and the Commanding Officer, Marine Corps Air Station (Helicopter), New River will be advised of the intent of the Second Marine Aircraft Wing to discontinue the stated support for a definitive period of time.

Helicopter and Water Bucket to Suppress Wildfires

1. Purpose. The purpose of this document is to promulgate procedures and responsibilities for units of Marine Corps Base and the 2d Marine Aircraft Wing.

2. Responsibilities

a. Fire Department, Marine Corps Base

(1) On notification by Base Maintenance personnel, the Fire Department dispatcher will make the request for water bucket deployment.

(2) During normal working hours, the point of contact is Marine Corps Air Station (H), New River, MAG 26 Operations, Group Operations Officer, phone 455-6150/6360.

(3) After normal working hours, the MAG 26 Duty Officer, phone 455-6126/6127, will authorize requests for water bucket deployment after notifying the Wing Staff Duty Officer. (Autovon) 486-8126/8127 (Requesting Wing Standby Aircraft).

b. Base Maintenance Department, Marine Corps Base

(1) The Maintenance staff member who makes the initial bucket deployment request to the Fire Department will give the following data for transmittal via the Group Duty Officer to the helicopter pilot.

(a) Fire location by UTM grid coordinates.

(b) When the fire situation indicates the need for an additional helicopter for surveillance, along with the request, a suggested pickup point will be made (normally an LZ).

(2) If known, the initial point of water drop may be transmitted in the request for bucket deployment.

(3) Perform all required maintenance on the helicopter bucket.

c. Helicopter Pilot

(1) The pilot will check in with Range Control, call sign "BLACKBURN" frequency 38.60 for clearance to fire location before entering Camp Lejeune airspace.


(2) Immediately after the bucket is deployed, the pilot will contact "LOTION GROUND" on the standard assigned primary frequency of 49.70 and identify his call sign. If contact cannot be established on the primary frequency, the pilot shall try to establish contact on the secondary frequency of 30.55.

(3) At the point of initial radio contact from "LOTION GROUND" the pilot will take directions from the cognizant Natural Resources person at the fire concerning where and how water drops will be made.

(4) If radio contact cannot be established, the pilot will make 45° angle drops across the head of the fire.


(5) Pilot will inform Natural Resources of maintenance needs to the helicopter bucket, phone 451-2195/2083.

3. Tenure of Agreement. This agreement is effective upon signature and will continue in effect until operational commitments preclude continuation. In the event this should occur the Commanding General, Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina and the Commanding Officer, Marine Corps Air Station (Helicopter), New River will be advised of the intent of the Second Marine Aircraft Wing to discontinue the stated support for a definitive period of time.



2. The meeting was precipitated by Recommendation 15 of a report, C-42828, prepared by the Naval Area Auditor, which states, "MCB establish operating procedures for the administration of the timber contracts". This recommendation resulted from four instances of a timber contractor being allowed to work prior to payments being received by the Government. In all cases, however, payment has now been received and the contracts are closed.

3. The responsible office for handling the sale of timber is listed in enclosure (1) which was jointly compiled by those present. The major point is that Base Maintenance Office will not allow a contractor to begin work prior to receipt of a copy of the letter from the Office in Charge of Construction to LANTDIV transmitting the payment. If necessary, the copy can be hand carried to BMO, Forestry.


4. Procedures for informal sales were also reviewed and the undersigned emphasized that the OICC was to be advised prior to any contact with prospective bidders. The OICC will then prepare the necessary forms and request bids. The whole process should take less than two weeks. The Base Forester is encouraged to provide names of three to five prospective bidders to the OICC, but is not to contact them prior to notifying the OICC. After making his requirements known, however, depending on the urgency, and by




joint agreement at that time, he may on occasion contact bidders and assist in getting bids.

5. Requirements for timber sales (schedule with draft specification) should be made known to PWD by BMO as much in advance as possible so as to permit an orderly processing of the documents.

6. In summary, the audit report did point up a problem area which was immediately corrected with no loss of money to the Government. Informal procedures were instituted at that time to prevent future occurrence and this meeting only reviewed and recorded those procedures. A memorandum of understanding between the Officer in Charge of Construction and the Base Maintenance Officer will be prepared which will satisfy the audit report recommendation. Enclosures (1) and (2) are intended to be included in that memorandum of understanding.

REF (a) BMO ltr MAIN/PEB/th of 20 Sep 1978

1. The paragraph proposed in reference (a) may not be used in that it would be tantamount to a sole source negotiated sale of Government property. Such sole sourcing is not authorized by DAR (formerly ASPR).
2. As directed by our technical monitors in the contracting business, we will use the following paragraph:

"ADDITIONAL CUTTING OF MERCHANTABLE TIMBER: Merchantable trees which are dead, diseased, overlooked during the original marking operations, or damaged by ice, lightning, wind, or fire (unless fire damage has resulted due to the negligence or fault of the Purchaser) may be marked and tallied by the Government, and felled and bucked into timber products, and removed from the Base by the Purchaser after approval. For such additional cutting, the Purchaser shall pay at the rate of 100 percent of the price bid for saw timber and 100 percent of the price bid for pulpwood."

1. Purpose. To publish instructions relative to the procurement, installation, lighting and removal of Christmas displays and decorations in BEQ's, BOQ's, dining facilities, administrative buildings, and government quarters within the Camp Lejeune area for the 1978 holiday season.

2. Information

a. Background. Because Christmas is one of our most joyful and festive occasions, total curtailment of outdoor holiday lighting on the Marine Corps Base and the Marine Corps Air Station (Helicopter) is not part of the energy conservation program this year. However, each unit and every individual living and working on the Base and Air Station is encouraged to exercise prudence in the use of exterior and interior decorations in keeping with sound energy conservation practices.

b. Harvesting of Greenery. The harvesting of pine trees, pine boughs, and holly on Marine Corps Base for Christmas decorations is authorized for designated activities, as outlined herein. This authorization is limited to the Naval Regional Medical Center, Naval Regional Dental Center, Marine Corps Air Station (Helicopter), New River, Base Special Services, Hostess House, Enlisted, NCO and Staff NCO Clubs, Commissioned Officers' Mess (Open), Camp Lejeune Dependents' Schools, and units of battalion (squadron) size and larger, upon approval of commanding officers. Trees over 10 feet in height will not be cut, nor will any tree within 100 feet of a paved road. All cutting is restricted to the following areas: the wooded area bound by Marines Road, Sneads Ferry Road and Highway 172, and the area bound by Verona Loop Road and U. S. Highway 17. Cutting will be done only during the period 4-24 December and will be subject to spot checks by Base Forestry personnel. Decoration material will not be provided by Base Maintenance. Christmas trees and decorations will be on sale through the Marine Corps Exchange.

c. Areas Authorized Displays. Prudently illuminated Christmas displays are authorized in:

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1 DEC 1978

(1) A central outdoor location for the Central Area, Areas 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, Industrial Area, French Creek Area, each separate camp, Marine Corps Air Station (Helicopter), Naval Regional Medical Center and Naval Regional Dental Center. Commanding officers of units of company size or larger may authorize interior displays and decorations in buildings under their cognizance.

(2) Support Facilities - Base Special Services activities, Hostess House, Enlisted, NCO and Staff NCO Clubs, Commissioned Officers' Messes (Open), Camp Lejeune Dependents' Schools, Marine Corps Exchange locations, Chapels and at Marine Corps Base and Marine Corps Air Station (Helicopter) gate locations.

(3) Government Family Housing - In addition to interior decorations, occupants of government quarters are authorized to install illuminated outdoor displays if substituted for the lights and wattage currently utilized by lights at entrance doors or in the vicinity of carports.

3. Installation of Decorations

a. Indoor and outdoor displays will be kept simple in design. Predominantly non-electric decorations and displays are encouraged.

b. Illuminated trees will not be located in sleeping spaces in BEQ's, BOQ's and government quarters.

c. Compensate for outdoor and indoor holiday decorations by turning off regular lights in the same room or general area while the holiday lights are on.

d. Decorations and displays will not be placed on the roofs of any building. Candles are prohibited for all displays.

e. Outdoor displays may be illuminated from sunset to 2300 daily, for the period 18 December 1978 through 2 January 1979. During special or religious observances on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve, displays may remain lighted through the religious services or events at Chapels and other facilities.

4. Refuse Pick Up

a. Trash pick up will be on a regular basis throughout the holiday period. Area commanders and commanding officers are requested to ensure that maximum use is made of available dumpster dumpsters and other trash receptacles. Boxes or containers will either be flattened or broken up before being placed in disposal containers.

b. Christmas trees will be collected on 29 December 1978 and 5 January 1979. All trees should be left in the vicinity of garbage cans or dumpster dumpsters in quarters areas.

5. Decoration Removal. All holiday decorations will be removed not later than 3 January 1979.

6. Applicability. Having received the concurrence of the Commanding Generals, 2d Marine Division, FMF, and 2d Force Service Support Group (Rein), FMF, Atlantic and the Commanding Officers of Marine Corps Air Station (Helicopter), New River, Naval Regional Medical Center and the Naval Regional Dental Center, this Bulletin is applicable to those Commands.


Dear Wendall:

1. Reference (a) has been carefully reviewed and although it is agreed that the proposal may in some instances accomplish the objective of lessening the workload associated with the timber sale program, there are other considerations as outlined below which are considered as essentially negative in impact on the activity forest management program.

a. To convey this Department's perspective, it has to be understood that the timberland management goal is designed around an orderly harvest of wood products. The proposed harvest schedule provided and referred to in reference (a) is based on a commitment made by this activity and agreed to by CMC to increase timber sales activity as a means of bringing harvests more in line with yields.

b. Combining of several compartments into a single large sale may result in some of the following problems.

(1) As small timber companies cannot afford the tie-up of operating capital associated with sales in the 3-4 million feet range, the large corporations (in this instance Georgia Pacific and Weyerhaeuser) may gain a monopoly on activity timber sales. Large sales combining scattered compartments cannot be adequately inspected by this Department and experience has shown that inspection is an absolute prerequisite to a successful, above board sales program.

(2) Another problem associated with large sales to large corporations is that large sales by necessity carry a lengthy contract completion time, resulting in a situation where the loggers work elsewhere during dry periods and use Camp Lejeune for wet weather logging. This results in unnecessary damage to base timberlands.

c. In many instances contract specifications and requirements vary considerably by compartment. Therefore, the combining of such requirements into one set of contract specifications is administratively more cumbersome and makes a less effective document for guiding harvest procedures.

d. There have been situations on government lands where large corporations were the only timber buyers and the result may have been a "setting" of prices.

e. Lastly, there are forthcoming developments from the DOD level that will separate timber sale proceeds from regular disposal funds. This will place each service on a "sink or swim" basis with regard to generation of sales that offset program operating costs. This change will take place at the beginning of the next fiscal period. Camp Lejeune is the backbone of the Navy forestry program; therefore, a planned execution of sales to produce a dependable cash flow will be of increased importance. Large sales and lengthy contract periods go hand in hand and will lead to revenue balance problems because the activity gives up a certain amount of control on such sales. In the face of forthcoming changes in forestry funding, the control of cash flow under conditions of a restricted manpower resource, would indicate a need for smaller more manageable sales as has been the case at Camp Lejeune, excepting the southern pine beetle salvage cutting of 1974 and 1975.




ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT

1. Introduction: Reference (b) permits only Tactical Landing Zones (TLZ's) for night helicopter operations and further states that Administrative Landing Zones (ALZ's) are not available for tactical training. This Command has a continuing need for a Tactical Landing Zone in close proximity to garrison areas to conduct battalion size lifts during both daytime and nighttime conditions. Due to the locations of TLZ's, TLZ SPARROW is the only suitable LZ meeting the requirement of close proximity to Division units. In response to reference (c), a meeting was conducted on 8 March 1978 at TLZ SPARROW. Representatives included Colonel Fridell, AC/S MCB Training; LtCol Ellis, Division Air Officer; LtCol Boles, MCB Training Facilities Officer; Major Harrison, Assistant Division Air Officer; Mr. Ken Harrison, MCB Forester; and Mr. Wooten, MCB Ecologist. The consensus of the group was that an obvious need exists to improve the existing landing zone to make it suitable for battalion sized lifts in all weather conditions.

a. Project Description: Proposed action consists of enlarging and improving TLZ SPARROW to accommodate a minimum of six CH-46 or six CH-53 helicopters simultaneously during periods of darkness. This action is needed to facilitate the movement of personnel to and from garrison areas without the support of additional ground transportation, thus generating savings from reduced maintenance and fuel costs associated with the movement of personnel to/from TLZs which are currently adequate for night operations. TLZ SPARROW is the only TLZ located within walking distance of this Command's primary garrison areas. The present LZ is located adjacent to the skeet range and is large enough to accommodate only three CH-46s simultaneously for daylight operations with commensurate reductions for night operations. Tab A depicts the existing landing zone. The area has large piles of mixtures of earth, trees, and brush located in it, thereby restricting its use by helicopters. The optimum improvement of TLZ SPARROW would consist of enlarging the present zone as shown on TABS A and B by the removal of the debris in the present zone and the removal of the trees and brush within the road boundaries to the NNE of the present zone. Subsequent to this enlargement, the area should be graded, leveled, and seeded. The completed TLZ will then require periodic maintenance. In addition to these improvements, obstruction lights should be mounted on the skeet range houses, high poles and antennas in the immediate vicinity. The impact of these actions on the existing environment will be negligible to nonexistent. Due to the terrain, the removal of trees and growth would not cause increased erosion by water.

A. REISSUANCE AND PURPOSE

This Directive reissues reference (a) to (1) prescribe DoD policies and establish an integrated DoD program for multiple-use management of the renewable natural resources on Defense lands, consistent with the military missions; and (2) implement references (b) and (c), which charge the Secretary of Defense with certain responsibilities for the management, conservation and development of natural resources and public outdoor recreation on DoD installations.

B. APPLICABILITY AND SCOPE

1. The provisions of this Directive apply to the Office of the Secretary of Defense, the Military Departments, and the Defense Agencies (hereafter referred to collectively as "DoD Components"). The term "Military Services," as used herein, refers to the Army, the Navy, the Air Force, and the Marine Corps.


2. Its provisions encompass the conservation and management of natural resources and related programs, projects, or instruments involving DoD land and water areas.

3. Nothing contained herein or in implementing regulations and cooperative agreements shall modify any rights granted by treaty or otherwise to any Indian tribe or to members thereof.

C. POLICIES

1. General

a. The Department of Defense, as an important occupier of Federal lands, will act responsibly and effectively in



conservation management and environmental protection including the duty to restore, improve, develop and conserve through wise use, the renewable natural resources on the lands and waters under military control.

b. A conscious and active concern for the values of natural resources will be considered in all DoD plans and programs. All such plans and programs shall be in full consonance with Pub. L. 91-190 (reference (d)) and DoD Directive 6050.1 (reference (e)).

c. The conservation programs required by the provisions of this Directive and the military mission need not, and shall not, be mutually exclusive.

2. Specific


a. DoD personnel at all echelons of command will support national conservation and enhancement policies and programs in accordance with this Directive. Intelligent and sympathetic understandings of natural resources, natural beauty, environmental quality, and recreation potentials, and the relationship and responsibility at all DoD echelons to such problems, must be an important and identifiable function of command management (section D.).

b. Since the natural resources disciplines encompassed within this Directive are sciences, all commanders will require the optimum use of professionally trained personnel to ensure the necessary technical guidance in the planning and execution of the several programs. This includes the identification and use of military personnel with education and experience in the natural resources disciplines where compatible with the primary military mission.

c. To increase the scientific knowledge of personnel and to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the Defense resources program, representation and participation at related professional meetings is encouraged.

3. Cooperation and Coordination. DoD Components will assure that the appropriate commanders concerned take the initiative to seek the aid of appropriate natural resource agencies (Federal, State, and local):

a. For assistance in developing an inventory of the DoD installation's natural resources and a plan for their use.


- b. For identification of endangered or threatened species of flora and fauna.
- c. For providing technical advice and assistance.
- d. In cooperative research projects.
- e. In obtaining (where possible) assistance in the form of plantings, and the stocking of wildlife and fish.

4. Multiple-Use Natural Resources Conservation Management. All DoD installations shall be managed so as to:

- a. Protect, conserve, and manage the watersheds and natural landscapes, the soil, the forest and timber growth, the fish and wildlife and endangered species as vital elements of an optimum natural resources program.
- b. Utilize and care for natural resources in the combination best serving the present and future needs of the United States and its people.
- c. Provide for the optimum development of land and water areas and access thereto in accordance with section E. Multiple use, by no means an assemblage of single uses, is defined, within the meaning of this Directive, as a conscious, coordinated management of the resources, each with the other, without impairment of the productivity of the land or water.

D. RESPONSIBILITIES

1. The Assistant Secretary of Defense (Manpower, Reserve Affairs and Logistics) or a designee, shall be responsible for administering the provisions of this Directive, for implementing policy, and for:
 - a. Assuring effective coordination with other elements of the Office of the Secretary of Defense and with other Federal agencies involving conservation and natural resources matters.
 - b. Assuring appropriate compliance with the policies concerning conservation and natural resources matters by the various DoD elements.
 - c. Providing a designee to chair the DoD Natural Resources Group (DNRG) in its activities.
 - d. Establishing policies, criteria, and standards relating to the Secretary of Defense Conservation Award Program.
 - e. Promulgating the details of program management and the development of appropriate DoD Instructions involving conservation and natural resources matters.



f. Providing management guidance to operating elements within DoD on conservation and natural resources matters.

2. The Secretaries of the Military Departments shall be responsible for:

a. Designating appropriate staff members to serve on the DNRG.

b. Assuring that commanders of DoD installations establish progressive conservation and natural resources programs and appoint an active Installation Natural Resources Committee to approve advice on the program.

c. Requiring an established system for annual technical program inspections.

E. RESOURCE PROGRAM POLICIES

1. Programing, Budgeting and Financing. The DoD Components concerned will make provisions in their programing, budget estimates, financing and land management programs for conducting effective conservation programs, consistent with the provisions of this Directive.


a. The cost of the natural resources and related programs will be the responsibility of the DoD Components involved and must be accomplished within financing available to the Components.

b. An overall natural resources management plan will be developed which will be in consonance with State, local and other Federal objectives for multiple-use management of natural resources and protection and enhancement of the environment. More detailed plans will be required for an integrated program for soil and water, forestry, fish and wildlife, recreation and natural beauty.

2. Soil and Water Management

a. An essential part of every natural resources management plan shall be a soil and water conservation plan. This plan will show all phases of land use and grounds development, from the least to the most intensively improved areas. The plan shall be in harmony with modern conservation practices, updated as required, and continuously applied in an orderly and timely manner.

b. To minimize the adverse impacts of construction and operations on land and vegetation, appropriate requirements for soil, water and plant conservation shall be determined for all projects as an integral part of the site development studies, and the necessary measures to meet these requirements shall be included in the improvements to be made. The adequacy of these measures will be reviewed by a qualified agronomist.



3. Forest Management

a. Consistent with site capability, marketability, and other conditions essential for economic production of wood products, forest management practices and operations will provide for sustained yield of quality timber, watershed protection and development of fish and wildlife habitat, recreation potential, and other resource values. The development and maintenance of a desirable biological balance in the forest community will be an objective of forest resource management.

b. The forest management programs of the Department of Defense are authorized and funded in accordance with 10 U.S.C. 2665 (reference (f)).

4. Fish and Wildlife Management

a. A continuing program of fish and wildlife habitat management, complying with accepted scientific practices integrated and consistent with the total natural resources will be the objective of the Defense Fish and Wildlife Management Program.

b. Cooperative agreements with the State and Federal Fish and Wildlife Conservation Agencies are required by 16 U.S.C. 670 (reference (c)).


5. Outdoor Recreation

a. DoD outdoor recreation policies reflect the national goal that all American people of present and future generations should be assured adequate outdoor recreation resources, and that all levels of Government shall take prompt and coordinated action to the extent practicable without diminishing or affecting their respective powers and functions to conserve, develop, and utilize such resources for the benefit and enjoyment of the American people (16 U.S.C. 460 (l), reference (g)).

b. Outdoor recreation and natural beauty and the protection and enhancement of environmental quality will be recognized as important objectives in the conduct of all DoD natural resource management programs.

6. Protection of Wetlands. Heads of DoD Components will provide leadership and take action pursuant to Executive Order 11990 (reference (i)) to minimize the destruction, loss or degradation of wetlands in carrying out their responsibilities for managing Federal lands and facilities under their control.

7. Endangered Species Protection. Heads of DoD Components will promulgate and enforce comprehensive regulations which establish procedures to ensure, under the requirements of Pub. L. 93-205 (reference (h)) that actions authorized, funded, licensed or carried out by them do not



jeopardize the continued existence of endangered or threatened species of fauna and flora, or result in the destruction or modification of the critical habitat of such species.

8. Natural Beauty and Base Attractiveness. Because sound natural resource management enhances natural beauty, conservation should include not only the classic methods of protection and development but also creative concepts of restoration and innovation. The objective of conservation should not be with nature alone, but with the total relationship between man and the environment. Thus, a conscious and active concern for the values of natural beauty will be considered in all DoD plans and programs. All such plans and programs shall be in full consonance with Pub. L. 91-190 (reference (d)) and DoD Directive 6050.1 (reference (e)).

F. ACCESS TO MILITARY LANDS AND WATERS

1. By the Public

a. Public access to DoD installations for the purpose of hunting and fishing and other natural resource enjoyment will be encouraged except where a specific finding has been made that the overriding military mission requires a temporary or permanent suspension of such use. When public access must be withheld, the reasons must be substantiated by a statement incorporated in the required cooperative agreement among the Military Departments, the State natural resource authorities, and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.


b. Where public access is permitted for hunting, fishing and other recreation purposes and can be granted without impairment of the bonafide military mission, that access shall be controlled and held within manageable quotas.

(1) In granting access privileges to persons other than those assigned to or living on DoD installations, manageable quotas will vary, depending upon the amount of suitable land and water areas and the population of fish and wildlife available for harvesting.

(2) Opportunities for recreational purposes must be equitably distributed by impartial selection procedures, such as drawing lots, or first-come-first-served basis. Nonconsumptive uses by the public, such as hiking or nature trails, ocean swimming, etc., will be encouraged.

2. By Federal and State Conservation Officials

a. Military Departments will ensure that appropriate commanders, in cooperation with the Governors, or their designees, of the States in which the installations are located, provide access to such installations for designated State, natural resource, or conservation officials at

such times and under such conditions as may be agreed upon (10 U.S.C. 2671, reference (b)).

b. Accredited conservation representatives of Federal agencies furnishing professional advice and technical assistance under this Directive also will be admitted to DoD installations.

c. Federal and State conservation officials provided access to DoD installations will be issued an appropriate Identification Card or Pass Permit, by the commander concerned, for use under the terms specified.

3. Signs and Outleasing Agreements

a. Signs identifying DoD installations should contain information to make it possible for Federal and State authorities, as well as private parties, to identify the DoD Component responsible for the area.

b. Outleases of military lands shall be based on natural resources management plans, and where possible, will complement such plans.

G. INSTALLATION CONSERVATION AND BEAUTIFICATION COMMITTEE

Military Departments will ensure that commanders of DoD installations having active or potential programs within the concept of this Directive shall appoint a Conservation and Beautification Committee.


1. The functions of the Committee are to (a) assure continuous planning and balanced application of the natural resource programs, and (b) plan, promote and foster objectives for natural beauty, both on-base and in cooperation with local communities.

2. The Committee shall be composed of, but not limited to, the commanding officer, natural resource management and engineer personnel, environmental protection, law enforcement, operations, safety, legal, medical, special services, veterinarian and other installation personnel who with their expertise, could contribute to the development and implementation of an integrated conservation and beautification plan.

3. Local individuals and civilian conservation groups, whenever feasible, should be invited to attend committee meetings as guests.

H. THE SECRETARY OF DEFENSE NATURAL RESOURCES CONSERVATION AWARD

The Secretary of Defense, to encourage and give added incentive for improvement of DoD natural resource activities, will annually present an award to the installation which conducted the most outstanding conservation program during the preceding 3 calendar years. The ASD(MRA&L) will chair a selection jury to recommend the winning installation to the Secretary of Defense in accordance with DoD Instruction 5000.13 (reference (j)).



I. DoD NATURAL RESOURCES GROUP (DNRG)

The Defense Natural Resources Group composed of the ASD(MRA&L) as Chairman and designees of the Secretaries of the Military Services is hereby reestablished. Each Military Service shall appoint (1) a principal representative having authority and responsibility to make decisions, and (2) such technical specialists as necessary to fully participate in their functional areas of the DNRG responsibility. The DNRG, in addition to its individual and primary duty assignments, shall:

1. Facilitate the interservice utilization of personnel assigned throughout the Department of Defense who possess the differing skills of the several disciplines in natural resources management.
2. Provide technical support to the ASD(MRA&L) in the various natural resources disciplines.
3. Plan and direct a biennial DoD Natural Resources Conference.
4. Develop, propose, and review natural resources policies, including natural beauty, and collaborate, as applicable, on the resolution of conservation problems.
5. Assist in the planning and execution of the annual Conservation Award program.


J. COMMUNITY RELATIONS AND CIVIL RIGHTS

1. In developing agreements and procedures with State and local authorities, the DoD Components will bear in mind at all times the importance of establishing, maintaining, and improving Armed Forces community relations in keeping with the provisions of DoD Directive 5410.18 (reference (k)).


2. No person shall, on the ground of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination in, receiving the privilege of public access or any other uses within the terms of this Directive and DoD Directive 5500.11 (reference (l)).

K. EFFECTIVE DATE AND IMPLEMENTATION

 - b. Assuring appropriate compliance with the policies concerning conservation and natural resources matters by the various DoD elements.
 - c. Providing a designee to chair the DoD Natural Resources Group (DNRG) in its activities.
 - d. Establishing policies, criteria, and standards relating to the Secretary of Defense Conservation Award Program.
 - e. Promulgating the details of program management and the development of appropriate DoD Instructions involving conservation and natural resources matters.



f. Providing management guidance to operating elements within DoD on conservation and natural resources matters.

2. The Secretaries of the Military Departments shall be responsible for:

a. Designating appropriate staff members to serve on the DNRG.

b. Assuring that commanders of DoD installations establish progressive conservation and natural resources programs and appoint an active Installation Natural Resources Committee to approve advice on the program.

c. Requiring an established system for annual technical program inspections.

E. RESOURCE PROGRAM POLICIES

1. Programing, Budgeting and Financing. The DoD Components concerned will make provisions in their programing, budget estimates, financing and land management programs for conducting effective conservation programs, consistent with the provisions of this Directive.


a. The cost of the natural resources and related programs will be the responsibility of the DoD Components involved and must be accomplished within financing available to the Components.

b. An overall natural resources management plan will be developed which will be in consonance with State, local and other Federal objectives for multiple-use management of natural resources and protection and enhancement of the environment. More detailed plans will be required for an integrated program for soil and water, forestry, fish and wildlife, recreation and natural beauty.

2. Soil and Water Management

a. An essential part of every natural resources management plan shall be a soil and water conservation plan. This plan will show all phases of land use and grounds development, from the least to the most intensively improved areas. The plan shall be in harmony with modern conservation practices, updated as required, and continuously applied in an orderly and timely manner.

b. To minimize the adverse impacts of construction and operations on land and vegetation, appropriate requirements for soil, water and plant conservation shall be determined for all projects as an integral part of the site development studies, and the necessary measures to meet these requirements shall be included in the improvements to be made. The adequacy of these measures will be reviewed by a qualified agronomist.



3. Forest Management

a. Consistent with site capability, marketability, and other conditions essential for economic production of wood products, forest management practices and operations will provide for sustained yield of quality timber, watershed protection and development of fish and wildlife habitat, recreation potential, and other resource values. The development and maintenance of a desirable biological balance in the forest community will be an objective of forest resource management.

b. The forest management programs of the Department of Defense are authorized and funded in accordance with 10 U.S.C. 2665 (reference (f)).

4. Fish and Wildlife Management

a. A continuing program of fish and wildlife habitat management, complying with accepted scientific practices integrated and consistent with the total natural resources will be the objective of the Defense Fish and Wildlife Management Program.

b. Cooperative agreements with the State and Federal Fish and Wildlife Conservation Agencies are required by 16 U.S.C. 670 (reference (c)).


5. Outdoor Recreation

a. DoD outdoor recreation policies reflect the national goal that all American people of present and future generations should be assured adequate outdoor recreation resources, and that all levels of Government shall take prompt and coordinated action to the extent practicable without diminishing or affecting their respective powers and functions to conserve, develop, and utilize such resources for the benefit and enjoyment of the American people (16 U.S.C. 460 (l), reference (g)).

b. Outdoor recreation and natural beauty and the protection and enhancement of environmental quality will be recognized as important objectives in the conduct of all DoD natural resource management programs.

6. Protection of Wetlands. Heads of DoD Components will provide leadership and take action pursuant to Executive Order 11990 (reference (i)) to minimize the destruction, loss or degradation of wetlands in carrying out their responsibilities for managing Federal lands and facilities under their control.

7. Endangered Species Protection. Heads of DoD Components will promulgate and enforce comprehensive regulations which establish procedures to ensure, under the requirements of Pub. L. 93-205 (reference (h)) that actions authorized, funded, licensed or carried out by them do not



jeopardize the continued existence of endangered or threatened species of fauna and flora, or result in the destruction or modification of the critical habitat of such species.

8. Natural Beauty and Base Attractiveness. Because sound natural resource management enhances natural beauty, conservation should include not only the classic methods of protection and development but also creative concepts of restoration and innovation. The objective of conservation should not be with nature alone, but with the total relationship between man and the environment. Thus, a conscious and active concern for the values of natural beauty will be considered in all DoD plans and programs. All such plans and programs shall be in full consonance with Pub. L. 91-190 (reference (d)) and DoD Directive 6050.1 (reference (e)).

F. ACCESS TO MILITARY LANDS AND WATERS

1. By the Public

a. Public access to DoD installations for the purpose of hunting and fishing and other natural resource enjoyment will be encouraged except where a specific finding has been made that the overriding military mission requires a temporary or permanent suspension of such use. When public access must be withheld, the reasons must be substantiated by a statement incorporated in the required cooperative agreement among the Military Departments, the State natural resource authorities, and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.


b. Where public access is permitted for hunting, fishing and other recreation purposes and can be granted without impairment of the bonafide military mission, that access shall be controlled and held within manageable quotas.

(1) In granting access privileges to persons other than those assigned to or living on DoD installations, manageable quotas will vary, depending upon the amount of suitable land and water areas and the population of fish and wildlife available for harvesting.

(2) Opportunities for recreational purposes must be equitably distributed by impartial selection procedures, such as drawing lots, or first-come-first-served basis. Nonconsumptive uses by the public, such as hiking or nature trails, ocean swimming, etc., will be encouraged.

2. By Federal and State Conservation Officials

a. Military Departments will ensure that appropriate commanders, in cooperation with the Governors, or their designees, of the States in which the installations are located, provide access to such installations for designated State, natural resource, or conservation officials at

such times and under such conditions as may be agreed upon (10 U.S.C. 2671, reference (b)).

b. Accredited conservation representatives of Federal agencies furnishing professional advice and technical assistance under this Directive also will be admitted to DoD installations.

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
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
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

2442 - DESIGNATING TIMBER FOR CUTTING2442.8 - Technical Guide for Timber Marking

1. *-Leave-* Tree Marking in Immature Pine Stands. Extensive tests *- and actual sale conditions, using the leave-* tree method of thinning overstocked immature poletimber pine stands show it results in better and more consistent silvicultural treatment and higher yields per acre than present methods. As rapidly as practicable, *- all Forests should-* adopt thinning by the *-leave-tree method as standard in appropriate situations, *** with particular emphasis on pine stands under 35 years of age.

Procedural steps in applying the *-leave-* tree method:

a. Selection of Proper Spacing

*- (1) Run cruise line through individual stand selected for leave tree marking which will adequately sample prevailing DBH of acceptable dominant and co-dominant leave trees. At each sample point, select nearest dominant or co-dominant which is acceptable as a leave tree and record its DBH. Summarize by DBH classes and determine estimated prevailing DBH of leave trees. In instances of abnormal distribution of leave trees by diameter, use the average DBH of the leave trees.

(2) Determine leave tree spacing from Exhibit 1. Spacing by Prevailing Leave Tree DBH. -*

2. *- Tree Selection Marking.

a. Select leave trees on grid basis (See Exhibit 2) using hand compass and pacing. Do not select overtopped or suppressed trees. Use intermediates only where there are no acceptable dominant or co-dominant trees. Mark leave trees with paint below stump height and at head height preferably on opposite sides of the stem. Based on the predetermined spacing, the marker will then select the best tree in the grid square, see Exhibit 2. For example, a stand is to be thinned to 21-x 21-foot spacing. This will mean a grid square of 21-foot square per leave tree. A marker will use a staff, stick or other effective device to mark the center of the 21-foot square. He will then select the best potential leave tree in the square. The tree selected can be anywhere*-in the square.

b. Tree Selection Marking

a. Select leave trees on grid basis (See Exhibit 2) using hand compass and gaging. Do not select overtopped or suppressed trees. Use intermediate only where there are no acceptable dominant or co-dominant trees. Mark leave trees with paint below stump height and at head height preferably on opposite sides of the stem. Based on the predetermined spacing the marker will then select the best tree in the grid square. For example, a stand to be thinned to 21' x 21-foot spacing. This will mean a grid square of 21-foot square per leave tree. A marker will use a staff, stick or other effective device to mark the center of the 21-foot square. He will then select the best potential leave tree in the square. The tree selected can be marked in the square.

However, if two or more dominant or co-dominant trees are equally acceptable, select the tree closest to the center point. After selecting the tree and marking it, the marker must go back to the center point and pace 21 feet in the selected compass direction to the next grid square center. He then repeats the procedure and selects a tree from the next 21- x 21-foot square.

3. Leave Tree Marking in Poletimber Hardwood Stands. Leave tree marking may be used in thinning poletimber hardwood stands. Selection methods and spacing are covered in FSM 2471.3 - Intermediate Cutting. Individual trees will be marked in a manner similar to that outlined for pine leave tree marking.

4. Sale Volume Determination.

- a. After leave trees are marked, determine volume of merchantable unmarked trees to be cut by Region 8 Area. Estimate procedures in FSM 2443.64. Point sampling should be on the basis of a maximum of one point per acre. Tally all trees to be cut by diameter and merchantable height on R8 Form 2400.41. Measure the DBH on all trees to be cut, and measure the height on at least one tree at each point. The balance of the merchantable heights may be estimated.--*

however, if two or more dominant or co-dominant trees are equally acceptable, select the tree closest to the center point. After selecting the tree and marking it, the marker must go back to the center point and pace 31 feet in the selected compass direction to the next third square center. He then repeats the procedure and selects a tree from the next 31 x 31-foot square.

3. Leave Tree Marking in Polelimber Hardwood Stands. Leave tree marking may be used in thinning polelimber hardwood stands. Selection methods and spacing are covered in FSM 2443.2 - Intermediate Cutting. Individuals of trees will be marked in a manner similar to that outlined for pine leave tree marking.

4. Sale Volume Determination.

a. After leave trees are marked, determine volume of merchantable unmarked trees to be cut by Region 8 Area. Estimate procedures in FSM 2443.62. Point sampling should be on the basis of a maximum of one point per acre. Tally all trees to be cut by diameter and merchantable height on RS Form 2400.41. Measure the DBH on all trees to be cut, and measure the height on at least one tree at each point. The balance of the merchantable heights may be estimated.*



Spacing by Proving (Average) Leave Tree DBH


