CURRENT PROCEDURE

The demolition of any building which has been determined excess or beyond economical repair must be approved by Commander, Atlantic Division, Naval Facilities Engineering Command, Norfolk, VA 23511 Via: Commandant of the Marine Corps (LFF-1), Headquarters, U. S. Marine Corps, Washington, DC 20380

PROPOSED PROCEDURE (If a directive/order must be waived to implement proposal-Identify the specific reference.)

Authority be given to the local activity (Commanding General) to demolish temporary facilities which are excess or beyond economical repair. This activity will then notify the Commander, Atlantic Division, Naval Facilities Engineering Command, Norfolk, VA., and the Commandant of the Marine Corps (LFF-1) HQMC of facilities that will be demolished.

Directive/orders which would need to be waived are (1) MCO P11000.14 and NAVFACENGCOM P-73.

BENEFITS/ADVANTAGES

Local activity would be allowed to demolish facilities that are excess or beyond economical repair sooner resulting in a savings of maintenance dollars now required to maintain facilities in habitable condition which should be demolished.
