Onslow Beach, Camp Lejeune, NC

Dear Mr. Willett:

In accordance with the N.C. Coastal Management Guidelines and the Federal consistency policy, we are forwarding this consistency determination and project drawings for your review. The proposal consists of construction of approximately 700 lineal feet of 10" PVC potable water line adjacent to an existing 10" cast iron water line to be abandoned in place. The age and condition of the existing line, in addition to the requirement for frequent repairs, require construction of a new line as shown.

Protective measures will be followed in order to preserve the marsh vegetation and its productivity:

- a. Backfill for the pipe trench will be material excavated from the site in order to encourage natural recruitment of vegetation over the new trench.
- b. Surplus material not required for filling will be spread evenly over the adjacent marsh to avoid creating mounds of soil upon which the surrounding marsh grasses could not establish. The area of this disturbance will be kept to the minimum required for the project.
- c. Replacement of existing upper layer of sod and roots following the backfilling of the trench will be accomplished.

The replacement of the line will limit future disturbances of this marsh which would have been required by future maintenance of the existing line. It is recognized that this project will create a short-term disturbance of the marsh within the pipeline area. Adherence to the above measures should provide for the vegetation to return to pre-project conditions within the long-term.
