

Dear Sir:

Holiday Mobile Home City has requested that our firm provide cable TV service to the residents of their trailer court located at Oxford Road in Jacksonville, North Carolina. It is not uncommon for cable TV firms serving military installations to also provide the same service to off-base areas.

I am writing to request your approval that our service here at Camp LeJeune be extended to the above off-base facility. I would wish to make you aware of the following information:


Our Contract RFP No. N62470-78-R-3012 anticipates the likelihood that on-base cable systems may also service off-base locations. I refer you to Section 01001, Paragraph No. 7 entitled Franchise Fees, and I quote:

"Where the Franchisee operates a CATV system in a nearby community, the Franchisee agrees to offer subscribers covered under this Agreement fees at least as low as those offered off-installation, unless the Franchisee can demonstrate that expenses uniquely associated with serving the installation cause higher fees. If the Franchisee operates in a nearby community, the Franchisee also agrees to make available to the Officer in Charge, at any time upon the latter's demand, a schedule of its off-installation fees".

I am enclosing documents verifying that our firm has obtained all necessary permits to extend our service to Holiday Mobile Home City. In addition, you will note that the proposed fees for off-base service substantially exceed our on-base fees. Furthermore, we will not provide off-base residents with access to Channel 13, the base command channel here at Camp LeJeune. This channel will be trapped and left unused.

Our off-base extension would proceed from Pole D-22, and proceed by underground cable for a distance of approximately 150 feet, where it then exits base property. I have enclosed maps indicating this proposed routing.

Holiday Mobile Home City consists of some 500 trailers, most of which I understand are rented to or owned by military personnel. Our firm is of the opinion that an extension of our cable plant to Holiday Mobile Home City in no way compromises the intent or understanding implicit in our contract with the government. We do recognize the necessity to inform your office of our



If you require further information concerning this proposed project, please let me know, and we will await any further work on this project until we have heard from your office.







Our tenants are very pleased to learn that they may be able to receive cable television services from your company in the near future.


In accordance with your instructions we have established a proposed rate schedule. We will charge \$6.50 per month for the basic cable service (channels 2 thru 12).
