WORK PLAN I

SMALL GAME STRIPS

Justification: To clear and establish 48 new small game strips for quail, rabbit, and wild turkey which will improve habitat and provide more successful hunting.

Procedure:

1. Strips will be one-fourth acre in size and will be dispersed at quarter mile intervals.
2. Clearing will be completed with the use of a bulldozer and heavy disc in late winter.
3. Planting will be conducted during early spring, with the establishment of annual mixtures at the rate of 40 lbs. per acre, and fertilization will be at the rate of 800 lbs. of 8-8-8 per acre.

Schedule: February (clearing), May(planting).

Location: Areas QB, GC, GI, GH, GG, HE, HF, IE

DOVE PLANTINGS

Justification: Plantings will be established to serve as feeding and shooting areas for mourning dove management and recreational hunting.

Procedure:

1. Dove plantings will be from three to five acres in size and will be established in existing wildlife food plots.
2. Plantings will be established during mid-summer to brown-top millet (80%) and proso millet (20% at the rate of 40 lbs. per acre.
3. Fertilization will be at the rate of 400 lbs. of 8-8-8 per acre.


Justification: To provide additional recreation for fishing, hunting, boating, and camping through the construction of a 200 acre reservoir.

Procedure:

1. Clearing of brush below the waterline will be completed by the Rod and Gun Club.
2. Construction of the dam, spillway and water control structure will be completed as a troop training project.
3. Fishery management, including removal of undesirable species from the water, restocking, water chemistry studies, etc., will be conducted by the Wildlife Conservation Unit and the Division of Fishery Services, Bureau of Sports Fisheries and Wildlife.

Schedule: July through June

Location: Wallace Creek east of Piney Green Road

WORK PLAN IV

FISH POND MANAGEMENT

Justification: To continue the management of the eight existing fresh water ponds for recreational fishing.

Procedure:

1. Fertilization will be at the rate of 40 lbs. of 20-20-5 per acre.
2. Liming with agricultural lime will be conducted as necessary as indicated by water chemistry studies.
3. Aquatic weed control will be conducted as necessary with the use of chemicals.
4. Access roads and shorelines will be kept clear of brush as necessary.
5. Seine sample analysis will be made as necessary for controlling over-population and determining reproductive success.
6. Channel catfish will be on a daily feeding schedule when the water temperature is above 60° F.

Schedule: Year-round.

Location: Prince, Hog Pen, Oak, Hickory, Mile Hammock, Cedar Point, Ward, Courthouse Bay and Power Line Pond.

WORK PLAN V

CLEARING AND MAINTENANCE OF WILDLIFE OPENINGS

Justification: To clear twenty new wildlife openings to serve as feeding, resting, and nesting areas for forest game species.

Procedure:

1. Site selection will be large, unbroken stands of mature timber where openings are relatively nonexistent.
2. Openings will be created by mowing and maintenance will consist of mowing at three year intervals.
3. Natural wild plant succession will provide green and dry grazing, and may require light fertilization on some openings.

Schedule: March

Location: Areas HC, JB, JA, RA, FA, IC

WORK PLAN VI

WILDLIFE PHOTOGRAPHY

Justification: To provide needed photographs of wild birds, animals, fish, and related subjects for educational purposes and conservation reports.

Procedure:

1. The purchase of a camera for use by the Wildlife Conservation Unit, with a 35mm body and a 400mm telephoto lens will provide permanent photo records which can be filed and used as necessary.
2. Color slides will be used for educational purposes with scout organizations, clubs and schools on the base.
3. Black and white photographs will be made available for conservation reports, etc.
4. Photographic activities will be regularly conducted during daylight and at night throughout the year to produce acceptable photographs.

Schedule: Year-round.

Location: Land and waters of the Base.



SMALL GAME STRIPS





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
