1. During reference (a) plans to improve an existing boat ramp on Base property on the northwest side of Sneads Ferry Bridge which spans New River, Onslow County, North Carolina, were discussed. Enclosures (1) and (2) provide details of the proposed project and enclosure (3) indicates the construction site. *Enclosure (4) contains data required under the privacy Act.*

2. It should be noted that some excavation below the mean high water in an area where no marsh grass is established will be necessary. Also *man* ~~many~~ *sub* will be placed below the mean high water to protect the ramp from tides and wave action.

3. It has been determined to the best of my knowledge that the proposed project is in compliance with the State of North Carolina approved coastal management program and will be conducted in a manner consistent with same.
