Subj: Resource Recovery

(2) Instruction for the recovery of newspaper material

1. Purpose. To publish implementing instructions by which selected waste materials will enter the resource recovery program, established by reference (a).

2. Background

a. As technology improves our standard of living, the volume of our material waste increases. However, waste material can be recycled to reduce the unnecessary depletion of natural resources.

b. Recoverable materials take many forms. A preliminary study reveals that sufficient quantities of waste materials are generated aboard Camp Lejeune so that a waste recovery program is feasible.

3. Information

a. Mixed waste is not usable in the recycling program, therefore, waste must be separated by category and deposited in the appropriate container.

b. Dumpster containers are provided at heavy use locations. The containers are painted a preselected color and have letters designating category of waste, i.e., "CORRUGATED ONLY," "NEWSPAPERS ONLY."

c. A recovery plant with a baler is operated in Building 738 by the Onslow County Workshop. The last local sorting of waste is done at this plant.

d. Enclosures (1) and (2) contain specific instructions for the recovery of waste materials. Instructions for the recovery of beverage containers and office wastes will be promulgated at a later date.

4. Action

a. Commanding officers, officers in charge, and supervisors will give the contents of this Order the widest possible dissemination to ensure that recyclable materials are placed in the applicable containers, to the greatest extent practicable.

b. The Joint Public Affairs Officer will provide appropriate publicity for resource recovery on a continuing basis.

5. Applicability. Having received the concurrence of the Commanding Generals of 2d Marine Division (Rein), FMF and Force Troops/2d FSSG, and the Commanding Officers of the Naval Regional Medical Center and the Naval Regional Dental Center, this Order is applicable to those Commands. The Commander, Marine Corps Air Bases, Eastern Area has also concurred with this Order, which is applicable to units at Marine Corps Air Station (H), New River.

INSTRUCTION FOR THE RECOVERY OF CORRUGATED CARDBOARD MATERIAL

1. Definition. For the purpose of this Order, corrugated cardboard is that material used as shipping containers, generally used in shipping such items as mattresses, chests of drawers, lamps, etc., free of bonding and sealer material, such as tar. Corrugated cardboard containing a bonding/sealer material cannot be recycled.

2. Collection Containers. Containers for the purpose of collecting corrugated cardboard are painted green with yellow lettering stating "CORRUGATED CARDBOARD ONLY." These containers have been placed to provide the bulk users with convenient locations. Other users may deposit corrugated cardboard in these containers, or may deliver corrugated cardboard directly to the processing plant.

3. Collection Locations. Corrugated cardboard collection containers are located at the following locations:

Central Area
Industrial Area
Hadnot Point

Hospital Point
Paradise Point
Tarawa Terrace



4. Responsibility

a. Until otherwise directed, the Base Maintenance Officer will maintain the dumpster containers described above.

b. By prior agreement, the Onslow County Workshop will operate the processing plant at Building 738 for the purpose of baling corrugated cardboard and other recyclable waste materials.

INSTRUCTION FOR THE RECOVERY OF NEWSPAPER MATERIAL

1. Definition. For the purpose of this Order, newspaper is that material used in newsprint, free of magazine inserts and magazines..
2. Collection Containers. Containers for the purpose of collecting newspapers are painted red and blue with white lettering stating "NEWSPAPERS ONLY." These containers have been placed to provide convenient deposit-drops for users. Magazines cannot be used in newspaper recycling; therefore, magazines, and glazed paper inserts from newspapers, must not be deposited in these containers. Instructions for the recovery of magazines will be addressed in a separate enclosure at a later date.
3. Collection Locations. Newspaper collection containers are located in the following parking areas:

4. Responsibility

- a. Until otherwise directed, the Base Maintenance Officer will maintain dumpster containers described above.
- b. By prior agreement, the Onslow County Workshop will operate the processing plant at Building 738 for the purpose of baling newspaper and other recyclable waste materials.
- c. For positive control in preventing unsightly accumulation of newspapers outside a full Dempster container, those persons designated "responsible officers", above, will dial the extension affixed thereon to notify the collecting agency of the need for waste removal.
