

DEMOLITION-LANDSCAPE LANDFILL

This guide is prepared for site and operational plan approval for demolition-landscape landfills and is taken directly from the "Solid Waste Management Rules", recodified February 1, 1976, and amended effective April 15, 1979. The guide should be used in conjunction with the "rules" and its purpose is more clearly explained by the following section from the "rules".

.0117 VARIANCES

(a) In order to avoid undue hardships, promote the effective and reasonable application and enforcement of these rules, the Division of Health Services may grant variances from the requirements of these rules in accordance with such procedures and conditions as it may prescribe. Each application for variance shall be examined on the basis of conditions prohibiting full compliance.

The following waste will be accepted in the demolition-landscape landfill: stumps, limbs, leaves, concrete, brick, wood, and uncontaminated earth.

✓ PROCEDURE FOR OBTAINING A PERMIT TO OPERATE A DEMOLITION-LANDSCAPE LANDFILL

- (1) Submit information for site approval only to the Division of Health Services.
- (2) Information reviewed by Corps of Engineers in Wilmington if site is located in floodplain.
- (3) Site approved/disapproved.
- (4) Letter sent to applicant advising of site approval/disapproval.
- (5) Submit information for operational plan.
- (6) Permit issued to applicant and permit conditions listed.

✓ INFORMATION FOR SITE APPROVAL FOR DEMOLITION-LANDSCAPE LANDFILLS

For review and approval, four copies of the following information shall be presented to the Division of Health Services for each proposed site.

- (1) Map or aerial photograph of sufficient scale to provide the following within 1/4 mile of the site:
  - a. Entire property owned or leased by the person providing the disposal site;
  - b. Location of all homes, industrial buildings, public or private utilities, roads, wells, watercourses, and other applicable details regarding the general topography.
  - c. If site is in 100-year flood plain, provide map showing relationship (Federal Insurance Agency map if available).
- (2) An approval letter from the unit of local government having zoning authority over the area where the site is to be located if request for approval is submitted by a private person.
- (3) Location of site on a county roadmap.
- (4) Any other information pertinent to the proposed site.

INFORMATION FOR OPERATIONAL PLAN APPROVAL FOR DEMOLITION-LANDSCAPE LANDFILLS

For review and approval four sets of the operational plans shall be submitted to the Division of Health Services and shall include:

- (1) A plot plan of the proposed site showing the property boundary, proposed landfilling limits, access controls and features such as roads, streams, etc.
- (2) Provisions for controlling erosion (erosion control plan).
- (3) Procedures for promoting vegetative growth as soon as possible on all completed areas (seeding and fertilizer specifications).
- (4) A description of the site that would be sufficient as a description in an instrument of conveyance (copy of deed) and property owner's name.
- (5) Anticipated type of material to be disposed of at the site.
- (6) Name and phone number of individual responsible for operation and maintenance of the site.
- (7) Projected use of land after completion of the fill.
- (8) Any other information pertinent to the proposed operational plan.
