
I look forward to seeing you at the next meeting of the Governor's Advisory Commission on Military Affairs.

GOVERNOR'S ADVISORY COMMISSION ON MILITARY AFFAIRS

May 27, 1987

A regular meeting of the Governor's Advisory Commission on Military Affairs was held at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, on May 27, 1987. Chairman Clyde Sullivan called the meeting to order. He first announced the new members to the Commission, Colonel Edward N. Brya, Commander of the 317th Tactical Airlift Wing and Pope Air Force Base; Thomas M. Sadler, Major General, Ret.; James E. Harrington, Secretary of Transportation; Claude Pope, Secretary of the North Carolina Department of Commerce; William Dunn, Assistant Secretary for Economic Development of Commerce; and David Eldridge, Assistant Secretary for Economic Development of Commerce. Chairman Sullivan also announced the resignation of former Senator William Redman, who was recently appointed as a Commissioner on the Utilities Commission.

Mr. Edward Garner, Jr. gave the Legislative Liaison Committee Report for Representative James Craven, chairman of this committee, who was unable to attend this meeting. The following bills have been filed in the North Carolina General Assembly:

- SB 18 Increase Federal Retirement Pay Exemption - Guy & Rand
 Status - Senate Finance Committee


- HB 1064 Lease Escape Clause - Representative Raynor
 An act to provide for early termination of residential
 rental agreements. This bill is in the House and will be
 voted on today. Representative Raynor is handling this
 bill.

- HB 142 Increase Federal Retirement Pay Exemption - In House
 Finance
 Has been amended to up from \$3,000 to \$4,000. Is for
 retired military only.

- SB 487 DWI - Senator Barnes
 An act to grant the Division of Motor Vehicles authority to
 reciprocally recognize suspensions and revocations of
 driving privileges imposed by commanders of all military
 installations. Status - J-I Committee

- HB 256 National Guard Pay Tax Exemption - Representative Lilly
 Increase Tax Exemption for National Guard pay from \$1,500
 to \$3,000.

- SB 660 Auto Insurance Rating Territories - Senators McDuffie; and
 Richardson
 Craven is aware that the provisions of this bill as written
 does not solve the problem. When this bill gets to the
 House, he will add an amendment so that it will apply to
 all counties.



A full-time staff position for the Governor's Advisory Commission on Military Affairs has been approved by the Governor's Office.

A report will be sent to each member of the Commission at the end of Session giving the status of the bills listed above.

It was decided by the members that a resolution by the Commission regarding the discrimination of military personnel is not needed. This is covered under General Statutes 127B-10 - 127B-15.

Edward Garner, Jr. discussed correspondence he received concerning the use of military air space for training. He suggested the possibility of setting up a committee consisting of representatives from each military installation. Lieutenant General Foss and Colonel Edward Brya both stated that this matter is under the jurisdiction of the FAA.


Colonel Woelfer, chairman of the Long Range Planning Committee, reported that his committee felt the economic impact statement should be done annually.

Colonel Woelfer also discussed the need to widen Highway 13 and build a bridge across the Cape Fear River to connect Fort Bragg via Highway 13 with Goldsboro and Seymour Johnson Air Force Base. Nat Robb stated that the Defense Access Fund had \$15 million last year, and North Carolina put bids in for approximately \$12 million worth of projects. We need more help on the congressional level.

The committee also emphasized the continuing need to encourage the employment of retired military as teachers. He also stated that Fort Bragg has been selected by the Department of the Army for Transition Management. Transition Management will assist and encourage those with remaining military years by providing assistance and show the military that they are still interested in them. This should help North Carolina by encouraging many highly qualified retirees to remain in North Carolina if they are assisted with finding a job and other activities.

Joseph Normandeau, chairman of the Employment Opportunities Subcommittee, stated that his committee felt the need to get in contact with potential retirees a year to 18 months in advance. He also suggested contacting employers and educating them as to the labor pool available through the retired military. Colonel Blahna suggested a single page resume to be sent to prospective employers that are looking for specific traits and talents.

Colonel Torbet, chairman of the Public Information Committee, reported that he would contact the National Association of Television Broadcasters for names and addresses of NC Broadcasters identified by congressional district. Herb Spauth has agreed to contact members of the NC delegation and request a copy of the mailing list. These two lists will be combined.



Nat Robb reporting for the Executive Committee, stated the following were the present primary areas of interest of the Executive Committee:

1. More units for National Guard/Reserve specifically Air Guard unit in Greensboro
2. Encourage more local purchases for North Carolina
 - a. Identify what is bought by DOD
 - b. Find sources in NC who might provide these services
 - c. Put industries into the system and educate the supplier
3. More land for the military
 - a. Fort Bragg short approximately 54,000 acres
 - b. Camp Lejeune short approximately 40,000 acres
4. Determine what kind of work is being done by contractors from outside North Carolina
5. Roads - The need to widen Highway 13 and build a bridge across the Cape Fear River to connect Fort Bragg via Highway 13 with Goldsboro and Seymour Johnson Air Force Base.
6. Public Relations - Executive Committee is planning to go to Washington, D.C., to brief the North Carolina Delegation on Commission's plans and invite them to North Carolina.

Major General Cassity stated that there is a lack of bids from North Carolina construction firms for local projects. We need to work on getting the word out to these local contractors. Wilkerson stated that North Carolina contractors should be able to bid low. Sadler commented that the military specifications and red tape are what's keeping North Carolina contractors out. Foss stated the cost of putting together these bids may prohibit interested North Carolina firms from bidding. Sullivan stated that this needs to be a state initiated program to encourage local work. Spaugh will get together with AGC and McDivitt and Street. They will come up with recommendations on what the state can do to include determining the best method to educate contractors in order to acquire North Carolina bids.

Lieutenant General John W. Foss invited the Commission to attend the CAPEX at Fort Bragg on July, 1, 1987, and will be sending out invitations.

Major General J. E. Cassity volunteered to host the August meeting for the Commission at Camp Lejeune.






1. The Governors Advisory Commission on Military Affairs (GACMA) is established to provide a forum for the discussion of issues of mutual concern between United States military installations in North Carolina and the State. The next meeting is scheduled to occur at Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, on 19 August 1987.

2. One current issue that is very prominent at the National, State and local level is the handling and disposal of hazardous material (HM) and hazardous waste (HW). Pursuant to the statutory scheme enacted by Congress, Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has approved State enforcement of hazardous waste management regulations. The North Carolina Division of Health Services (DHS) is tasked to carry out the various enforcement actions.

3. In our continuing effort to maintain the dialogue between the military and civilian community, I propose that the military bases in North Carolina develop and present an appropriate briefing concerning our management of HM/HW for the next GACMA meeting. The brief would outline how we in the military deal with this extremely important issue.

4. My Director of Natural Resources and Environmental Affairs, Mr. Julian Wooten, has already contacted your action officers to obtain some initial impressions about this proposal. If you concur in the proposal, please let me or Mr. Wooten know as soon as possible. I suggest a planning session be conducted at 1000 on 22 July 1987 at Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina. The planning session should include appropriate subject matter and legal experts as you deem necessary and should be at the working officer level. The planning session will determine the feasibility of the proposal, proper format, items to be included, briefers and other necessary items.

5. I have requested comments from my staff; Marine Corps Air Station, Cherry Point; Fort Bragg; Seymour Johnson Air Force Base; Pope Air Force Base; and the U. S. Coast Guard Base, Elizabeth City.
