
FIKEWOOD AREA 6-8


FIREWOOD AREA 6-9 (ME AND MF AREAS SHADED PORTIONS ONLY)







1. In response to the subject proposed Base Order, concurrence is provided with the following changes:

a. Paragraph 4.

Policy. Add the word "downed" between "of" and "nonmarketable" in the first sentence. The felling of standing timber is extremely dangerous and much of the hardwood timber remaining standing after a harvesting operation is left to improve the hard mast producing capability of the habitat for wildlife.

b. Paragraph 5. Responsibilities.

(1) Paragraphs 5a and 5b should be deleted totally with the following paragraph inserted:

The Assistant Chief of Staff, Facilities through the Director, Natural Resources and Environmental Affairs Division will:

(a) Designate firewood areas available for firewood gathering.

(b) Erect and remove signs at designated firewood areas.

(c) Notify the Base Provost Marshal whenever new firewood collection areas are available for opening and older areas require closing.

(2) Paragraph 5c(4). Delete "Director, NREAD" and add "Base Provost Marshal".

c. Enclosure (1):

(1) Paragraph 2b. Delete "Director, NREAD" and add "Base Provost Marshal".

(2) Paragraph 3b. Delete "Under the cognizance of the Assistant Chief of Staff, Facilities, the Director, NREAD" and add "Base Provost Marshal".

Ref: (a) MCO P11000.8A

1. Purpose. To establish procedures governing the gathering of firewood.

2. Background. Reference (a) governs natural resource management and prescribes procedures for disposal of marketable wood products on a sustained and managed basis that supports multiple-use land management requirements.

3. Policy. It shall be the policy of this Command to allow limited gathering of ~~nonmarketable~~ wood products as a source of firewood for authorized personnel. ~~Nonmarketable~~ <sup>DOWNED</sup> timber is available in certain areas following timber harvests and may be used for firewood as a means of utilizing a resource that would otherwise be wasted.

4. Responsibilities.

<sup>NREAD DIRECTOR</sup>  
a. The ~~Base Maintenance Officer~~ will administer the firewood program through designation of sites in which firewood may be gathered and through processing, accounting and control of applicants wishing to cut and gather firewood.

<sup>NREA DIRECTOR</sup>  
b. The ~~Base Game Protector~~, ~~Base Maintenance Department~~, shall:

- (1) Issue annual firewood permits to qualified personnel. <sup>ADD</sup>
- (2) Issue daily passes for the gathering of firewood.
- (3) Maintain a record of personnel participating in this activity.
- (4) Supervise, inspect and monitor the program as directed by the ~~Base Maintenance Officer~~.  
<sup>ACIS FACILITIES</sup>
- (5) Maintain a listing, maps and directions to designated areas where firewood may be gathered.
- (6) Maintain a continuing inventory of firewood gathered.



~~c. The Base Forester, Base Maintenance Department, shall:~~

<sup>7</sup>  
(1) Maintain an up-to-date inventory of sites where nonmarketable timber is available for use as firewood and provide this information to the Base Game Protector.

<sup>8</sup>  
(2) Mark the designated areas and nonmarketable timber within the areas.

d. Participant Requirements

(1) Access for harvesting of firewood will be limited to active duty military, retired military personnel residing in the Camp Lejeune area and civilian employees of Marine Corps Base or Marine Corps Air Station (Helicopter), New River.

(2) Applicants for firewood permits will execute a Certificate of Understanding releasing the government from responsibility in the event of accident or injury.

(3) Applicants will sign a statement attesting that the firewood is for the applicant's personal use and will not be sold.

(4) Gathering of firewood will be strictly limited to designated areas only.

*WOOD PRODUCTS AVAILABLE FOR FIREWOOD*  
(5) ~~Nonmarketable timber~~ consists of ~~standing trees that have been marked with a yellow "spot", or trees that have been downed or previously cut and located within a site designated for firewood gathering.~~ Cutting or removal of any timber other than that designated above constitutes destruction or theft of government property.

5. Clearance for Firewood Gathering

a. To prevent possible conflict with training exercises, hunting, or other activities, and to provide for accounting and control of this activity, clearance with the ~~Base Game Protector~~ is required.

*NREAD DIRECTOR*

(1) Access will be granted on a first come, first served basis.

(2) Access will be based on possession of a valid firewood permit ~~(obtainable at the Base Game Protector Office, Building 4002, Midway Park).~~

*WHICH MAY BE PURCHASED AT B-1103 FOR \$25.00. THIS PERMIT IS VALID FOR 1 YEAR AND HARVESTING IS LIMITED TO 6 CORDS. VOLUME OF FIREWOOD HARVESTED WILL BE DETERMINED BY NREAD.*

(3) Access will be granted in the form of a one-day pass for gathering firewood (also obtainable at Building ~~4002~~).

(5) Failure to return the pass in accordance with paragraph 5a(4) will result in cancellation of the applicant's annual firewood permit, *WITH NO return for the unused portion.*

6. Safety. Personnel desiring to gather firewood pursuant to this Order are required to comply with all applicable safety regulations published by this Command.

7. Applicability. Having received the concurrence of the Commanding Generals, 2d Marine Division, FMF and 2d Force Service Support Group (Rein), FMFLant, and the Commanding Officers of Marine Corps Air Station (H), New River, Naval Regional Medical Center and Naval Regional Dental Center, this Order is applicable to those Commands.

CONCLUSION -

The present firewood program - a free permit system for downed wood at timber sale sites after the contract is closed - shows the following use:

a. From 29 August 1980 to 8 February 1983, our records show 2,452 free firewood permits issued or an average of 980 permits per year, which is less than the annual 1,219/\$25 permit needed to have a self-supporting program (See example (1) above). The record also shows that only an approximate 1,243.5 cords were removed during the entire period. Based on evidence at the logging deck site, it is known that a significant amount of this firewood was pine.

b. While sale of firewood is not economical in this area, sale of pulpwood and sawtimber based on good forestry techniques has resulted in the following:




BREWSTER BLVD AND STONE STREET




FIREWOOD AREA 6-5








FIREWOOD AREA G-12


TRAINING AREA G-G SHADED PORTION ONLY






FIREWOOD AREA 6-9 (ME AND MF AREAS SHADED PORTIONS ONLY)


