1. Purpose. To publish instructions relative to the obtaining, installation, lighting and removal of Christmas displays and decorations in BEQs/BOQs, dining facilities, administrative buildings and government quarters within the Camp Lejeune area for the 1987 - 1988 holiday season.

2. Information

a. Background. Because Christmas is one of our most joyful and festive occasions, curtailment of outdoor holiday lighting on the Marine Corps Base and the Marine Corps Air Station, New River is not part of the energy conservation program this year. However, each unit and every individual living and working on the Base and the Air Station is encouraged to exercise prudence in the use of exterior and interior decorations in keeping with sound energy conservation.

b. Harvesting of Greenery. The harvesting of pine trees, pine boughs and holly on Marine Corps Base for Christmas greenery is authorized for designated activities, as outlined herein. This authorization is limited to the Naval Hospital, Naval Dental Clinic, Marine Corps Air Station, New River, Base Special Services, Hostess House, Enlisted, NCO and Staff NCO Clubs, Commissioned Officers' Mess (Open), Camp Lejeune Dependents' Schools and units of battalion (squadron) size and larger, upon approval of commanding officers. Cutting trees or vegetation of any kind is prohibited within the "Endangered Species Restricted Areas." These areas are marked with white paint and endangered species signs. Trees over 10 feet in height will not be cut nor will any tree within 100 feet of a paved road. All cutting is restricted to the following areas: the wooded area bound by Marines Road, Sneads Ferry Road and Highway 172 and the area bound by Verona Loop Road and Highway 17. Cutting will be done only during the period 5-24 December and will be subject to spot checks by Base Forestry personnel. Christmas trees and decorations will be on sale through the Marine Corps Exchange for persons or units not authorized to harvest greenery. Appropriated funds may not be used for the purchase of any decorations.

c. Areas Authorized Displays. Prudently illuminated Christmas displays are authorized in:

(1) A central outdoor location for the Central Area, Areas 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5, Industrial Area, French Creek Area, each major command, Marine Corps Air Station, New River, Naval Hospital and Naval Dental Clinic. Commanding officers of units of company size or larger may authorize interior displays and decorations in buildings under their cognizance.



(2) Support facilities - Base Special Services activities, Hostess House, Enlisted, NCO and Staff NCO Clubs, Commissioned Officers Mess (Open), Camp Lejeune Dependents' Schools, Marine Corps Exchange locations, Chapels and at Marine Corps Base and Marine Corps Air Station, New River gate locations.

(3) Government Family Housing - In addition to interior decorations, occupants of government quarters are authorized to install illuminated outdoor displays if substituted for the lights and wattage currently utilized by lights at entrance doors or in the vicinity of carports.

3. Installation of Decorations

a. Fireproofing of trees with chemical is no longer required. However, the base of trees shall be cut at an angle and kept in a container of water during the entire period of display.

b. Indoor and outdoor displays will be kept simple in design. Predominantly non-electric decorations and displays are encouraged.

c. Illuminated trees will not be located in sleeping spaces in BEQs and government quarters.

d. Compensate for outdoor and indoor decorations by turning off regular lights in the same room or general area while the holiday lights are on.

e. Decorations and displays will not be placed on the roofs of any building. Candles are prohibited for all displays.

f. Outdoor displays may be illuminated from sunset to 2300 daily for the period 15 December 1987 through 2 January 1988. During special or religious observances on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve displays may remain lighted through the religious services or events at chapels and other facilities.

4. Refuse Pick Up. Trash pick up will be on a regular basis throughout the holiday period. Area Commanders and Commanding Officers are requested to ensure that maximum use is made of available dumpster dumpsters and other trash receptacles. Boxes or containers will either be flattened or broken up before being placed in disposal containers.

5. Decoration Removal. All holiday decorations will be removed not later than 7 January 1988.

6. Concurrence. This Order has been coordinated and concurred in by the Commanding Generals, II Marine Amphibious Force, 2d Marine Division, FMF, 2d Force Service Support Group (Rein), FMF, 6th Marine Amphibious Brigade, FMF, and the Commanding Officers, Marine Corps Air Station, New River, Naval Hospital and Naval Dental Clinic.

However, each unit and every individual living and working on the Base and the Air Station is encouraged to exercise prudence in the use of exterior and interior decorations in keeping with sound energy conservation.

b. Harvesting of Greenery. The harvesting of pine trees, pine boughs and holly on Marine Corps Base for Christmas greenery is authorized for designated activities, as outlined herein. This authorization is limited to the Naval Hospital, Naval Dental Clinic, Marine Corps Air Station, New River, Base Special Services, Hostess House, Enlisted, NCO and Staff NCO Clubs, Commissioned Officers' Mess (Open), Camp Lejeune Dependents' Schools and units of battalion (squadron) size and larger, upon approval of commanding officers. Cutting trees or vegetation of any kind is prohibited within the "Endangered Species Restricted Areas." These areas are marked with white paint and endangered species signs. Trees over 10 feet in height will not be cut nor will any tree within 100 feet of a paved road. All cutting is restricted to the following areas: the wooded area bound by Marines Road, Sneads Ferry Road and Highway 172 and the area bound by Verona Loop Road and Highway 17. Cutting will be done only during the period 5-24 December and will be subject to spot checks by Base Forestry personnel. Christmas trees and decorations will be on sale through the Marine Corps Exchange for persons or units not authorized to harvest greenery. Appropriated funds may not be used for the purchase of any decorations.

c. Areas Authorized Displays. Prudently illuminated Christmas displays are authorized in:

(1) A central outdoor location for the Central Area, Areas 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5, Industrial Area, French Creek Area, each major command, Marine Corps Air Station, New River, Naval Hospital and Naval Dental Clinic. Commanding officers of units of company size or larger may authorize interior displays and decorations in buildings under their cognizance.



1. Purpose. To publish instructions relative to the obtaining, installation, lighting and removal of Christmas displays and decorations in BEQ's/BOQ's, dining facilities, administrative buildings, and government quarters within the Camp Lejeune area for the 1982-1983 holiday season.

2. Information


a. Background. Because Christmas is one of our most joyful and festive occasions, curtailment of outdoor holiday lighting on the Marine Corps Base and the Marine Corps Air Station (Helicopter) is not part of the energy conservation program this year. However, each unit and every individual living and working on the Base and the Air Station is encouraged to exercise prudence in the use of exterior and interior decorations in keeping with sound energy conservation.

b. Harvesting of Greenery. The harvesting of pine trees, pine boughs and holly on Marine Corps Base for Christmas greenery is authorized for designated activities, as outlined herein. This authorization is limited to the Naval Regional Medical Center, Naval Regional Dental Center, Marine Corps Air Station (Helicopter), New River, Base Special Services, Hostess House, Enlisted, NCO and Staff NCO Clubs, Commissioned Officers' Mess (Open), Camp Lejeune Dependents' Schools, and units of battalion (squadron) size and larger, upon approval of commanding officers. Cutting trees or vegetation of any kind is prohibited within the "Endangered Species Restricted Areas." These areas are marked with white paint and endangered species signs. Trees over 10 feet in height will not be cut, nor will any tree within 100 feet of a paved road. All cutting is restricted to the following areas: the wooded area bound by Marines Road, Sneads Ferry Road and Highway 172, and the area bound by Verona Loop Road and Highway 17. Cutting will be done only during the period ~~4-23~~ December and will be subject to spot checks by Base Forestry personnel. Christmas trees and decorations will be on sale through the Marine Corps Exchange for persons or units not authorized to harvest greenery. Appropriated funds may not be used for the purchase of any decorations. 5-24

c. Areas Authorized Displays. Prudently illuminated Christmas displays are authorized in:

(1) A central outdoor location for the Central Area, Areas 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, Industrial Area, French Creek Area, each major command, Marine Corps Air Station (Helicopter), Naval Regional Medical Center and Naval Regional Dental Center. Commanding officers of units of company size or larger may authorize interior displays and decorations in buildings under their cognizance.

(2) Support Facilities - Base Special Services activities, Hostess House, Enlisted, NCO and Staff NCO Clubs, Commissioned Officers' Messes (Open),

d. Compensate for outdoor and indoor holiday decorations by turning off regular lights in the same room or general area while the holiday lights are on.

e. Decorations and displays will not be placed on the roofs of any building. Candles are prohibited for all displays.

f. Outdoor displays may be illuminated from sunset to 2300 daily for the period 15 December 1987 through 2 January 1988. During special or religious observances on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve, displays may remain lighted through the religious services or events at Chapels and other facilities.

4. Refuse Pick Up. Trash pick up will be on a regular basis throughout the holiday period. Area Commanders and Commanding Officers are requested to ensure that maximum use is made of available dumpster dumpsters and other trash receptacles. Boxes or containers will either be flattened or broken up before being placed in disposal containers.

5. Decoration Removal. All holiday decorations will be removed not later than 7 January 1988.


