

Subj: Oil Spills by Jenkins Oil Company

1. In response to your letters of 5 and 14 June 1979, the following comments are made.

a. Jenkins Oil Company letter of 1 June 1979 stated they would provide the contracting officer with a list of tanks that cannot be filled without spillage at the vents. Without this list the scope of the problem cannot be identified. Once the scope is identified, it can then be determined what corrective action would be the most feasible.

b. As a matter of information, Mr. Bailey of Jenkins Gas Company stated to Mr. G. Bardin, Family Housing, during a telephone conversation of 27 August 1979 that he had ordered 24" long automatic cut-off nozzles that in Mr. Bailey's opinion would do the job with a very limited amount of spillage.
