Subj: COORDINATION OF ENVIRONMENTAL PERMITS DURING PROJECT PLANNING AND DESIGN

Ref: (a) MARCORB Camp Lejeune ltr 6280 FAC of 18 Sep 86

1. We agree with the policy proposed by reference (a) of having copies of all permit correspondence sent directly both to MARCORB Camp Lejeune and to LANTNAVFACENGCOM. Therefore, on all future correspondence with North Carolina regulatory agencies we will request that any comments or questions regarding permits be addressed simultaneously to the appropriate Marine Corps activity and to LANTNAVFACENGCOM.

2. We suggest, however, that the rest of the permitting process remain unchanged. The initial permits generally applied for are permits to construct; these permits are issued to the agency controlling and directing the construction effort. Because of the significant impact that processing permit applications and obtaining construction permits can have on scheduling, we suggest this task be left with LANTNAVFACENGCOM.

The first part of the project was devoted to the study of the properties of the material under investigation.



Dear Mr. Bailey:

In accordance with your application received July 29, 1986, we are forwarding herewith Permit No. 13615, dated September 4, 1986, to the U. S. Navy for the construction and operation of the subject wastewater collection system extensions.

This permit shall be effective from the date of issuance until rescinded and shall be subject to the conditions and limitations as specified therein.

If any parts, requirements, or limitations contained in this permit are unacceptable to you, you have the right to request an adjudicatory hearing upon written request within 30 days following receipt of this permit. This request must be in the form of a written petition, conforming to Chapter 150B of North Carolina General Statutes, and filed with the Office of Administrative Hearing, Post Office Drawer 11666, Raleigh, North Carolina 27604.

If you wish to have the hearing before the Hearing Officer with this Department, you must indicate in the petition that you waive the right to have the contested case conducted by a Hearing Officer in the office of Administrative Hearings, and wish to have the matter conducted in the Department of Natural Resources and Community Development. Unless such demands are made this permit shall be final and binding.

Permit issued this the 4th day of September, 1986.



For the Discharge of Sewage, Industrial Wastes, or Other Wastes

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In accordance with the provisions of Article 21 of Chapter 143, General Statutes of North Carolina as amended, and other applicable Laws, Rules and Regulations

PERMISSION IS HEREBY GRANTED TO

The U. S. Navy  
Onslow County

FOR THE

construction and operation of a 200 GPM wet well pump station with dual non-submersible pumps, high water alarm, approximately 1,950 lineal feet of 6-inch force main and 220 lineal feet of 8-inch gravity sewer to serve Applied Instruction Building P-808 and to discharge collected domestic wastewater into Camp Lejeune's existing sewerage system,

pursuant to the application received July 28, 1986 and in conformity with the project plans, specifications, and other supporting data, subsequently filed and approved by the Department of Natural Resources and Community Development and considered a part of this permit.

This permit shall be effective from the date of issuance until rescinded and shall be subject to the following specified conditions and limitations.

1. This permit shall become voidable unless the facilities are constructed in accordance with the approved plans, specifications and other supporting data.
2. This permit is effective only with respect to the nature and volume of wastes described in the application and other supporting data.
3. The facilities shall be properly maintained and operated at all times.
4. This permit is not transferable.
5. The sewage and wastewater collected by this system shall be adequately treated in the Montford Point Wastewater Treatment Plant prior to being discharged into the receiving stream.
