

Subj: PHALANAX SOUND II; Use of Atlantic Intercostal Waterway/Onslow Beach,
Camp Davis and Oak Grove Training Sites

1. In accordance with ref (a) the following information requests are submitted for approval.
2. During the period 4-19 August, the 2nd Marine Amphibious Brigade will conduct Amphibious Exercise PHALANAX SOUND II utilizing significant training sites located on Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune. This exercise will provide a simulated combat environment in which to train and evaluate Marine Corps and Navy personnel conducting joint operations in air, land, fleet and unconventional warfare. In addition, this exercise will include a helicopterborne assault, an amphibious landing at Onslow Beach along with a logistical landing and subsequent buildup of the beach support area.
3. The amphibious landing will include construction and operation of a raft across the Atlantic Intercostal Waterway (AIWW) between pre-designated channel markers. The raft will begin operation at 0100 on 11 August and discontinue by 2350 11 August 1984. Closure of the AIWW is not required in order to conduct the exercise.
4. As part of the Combat Service Support element training, a simulated Amphibious Assault Bulk Fuel System will be located on Onslow Beach with a pipeline crossing to Tactical Landing Zone (TLZ) Albatross. There will be no transfer of bulk fuel. This system will pump fresh water from pre-staged bladders on Onslow Beach. The pipeline will be submerged under the AIWW between channel markers (Grid Coordinates, GC 911273) beginning on 10 August and will be removed by 13 August 1984. Due to the brief period and the tactical nature of the training, no identifying markings for use by watercraft in the AIWW are proposed to be placed at this location.
5. In accordance with ref (b) it is respectfully requested that appropriate notice (Notice to Mariners) be given to navigators using the waters in this area to exercise caution. 6. Additional approval is requested for utilizing Camp Davis during the period of 5 August through 12 August for Reconnaissance and Tactical Training and to use Oak Grove on 12 August through 13 August 1984 for a NEMVAC operation.
