Carole,

Supply well # 706 serves the Holcomb Blvd. Water Treatment Plant which supplies water to approximately 17,000 people (per the State permit). The majority of people served by this plant are residents who live in Base Housing, although this plant also serves the Base hospital and all of Camp Johnson. Therefore, it is estimated that approximately 70% of people served by this plant are adults and 30% are children. The Holcomb Blvd. Water Treatment Plant mixes, treats, and distributes approximately 2.211 million gallons per day utilizing 17-18 different supply wells. Well # 706 pumps approximately 66 gallons per minute for 12 hours per day, providing approximately 2.1% of the water supplied by this plant daily.

I just received the latest well-head sampling results yall sent. I just spoke with Brian Marshburn and he suggested I speak with you.

I wanted to speak with Mr. Stan Miller and / or Mr. Mack Frizelle in your water department to find out

- 1) which water system well # 706 was in
- 2) size of water system (large serving 100,000 people or medium serving 10,000)
- 3) any estimates of the number of adults and children separated out

As we follow up on all sites that we've made recommendations for, we report to Congress those types of numbers. The information will be compiled with similar information from other sites and included in our quarterly reports to congress.

QUESTION TO KATE → is there any new news from Ms. Ensminger?

Mick,

I think you are aware of all the latest ATSDR issues from our end. The latest 2 issues to come up were

- 1) the phone call that Andrea Lunsford of NEHC received in June from the father of the girl who died of leukemia - Andrea spoke to Martiza about this and we talked about it with you recently. Appears to have been basically the same conversation that your office has already had with him.
- 2) the meeting in DC with ATSDR, NEHC, Kelly Dryer, etc (this goes back to last December or so) regarding the ATSDR request for additional funding (\$2M) for the new study of adverse pregnancy outcomes. This is the meeting where it was apparent that some ATSDR personnel first realized that the Tarawa Terrace well contamination was from ABC Cleaners and not from an on-base source. We recommended at this meeting that ATSDR consider other funding sources before us since the contamination was from an off-base source (i.e. go thru EPA to private Superfund budget). We also recommended that they use the ABC Cleaners investigation information to assist in pinpointing the time frame that should be used for their study to narrow the search down from a 20+ year period which may or may not have included exposure to contaminants in supply wells to the best estimated period of exposure (perhaps only 5 years). Camp Lejeune did offer to make any records available in support of any study. I never heard what happened regarding the funding of that work (as far as I know, the study was never funded by anyone - ATSDR was going to get back with me to let me know what was happening).

Official Navy POC regarding any interface with ATSDR and the funding office for any ATSDR studies (such as the proposed \$2M one) is NEHC (Navy Environmental Health Center), Andrea Lunsford. You or your PAO may want to touch base with her just to keep everyone in the loop:

I am forwarding 2 emails that describe a potentially contentious issue. No action required at this time, but EMD would like to give PAO a heads up.

Not sure if you are aware of this situation that has been going on this past year...

PROBLEM: Essentially a contaminant plume from "ABC Cleaner" on ~~the~~ ^{CLW} 24 has drifted onto Lejeune property in the TT area over the past 20 years. The concern is contamination our drinking water in the Castle Hayne ~~area~~ ⁰⁰⁰⁰⁰⁰²⁹⁶⁹.

HISTORY: By the mid 1980s all drinking water wells in the area were shut
