ATSDR/U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Volatile Organic  
Compound Exposure in the MCB water supply.

Dear Sir,

Your office is no doubt aware that the Agency for Toxic Substances  
and Disease Registry (ATSDR) and the Environmental Protection Agency  
have identified MCB, CLWC as a major joint source contributor to  
the VOC contamination of the base water supply over a long time period.

My family lost a young son born at CLWC in 1967 to adverse  
birth outcomes that match in great detail the predicted toxicological  
effects of the presence of VOC's in the water supply and especially  
hazardous to children exposed while in utero.

What procedures or programs does MCB have in place now to  
counsel and/or to accept claims for personal injury or wrongful  
death?

Disclosure of this contamination problem comes many years after the  
fact. While disheartening to find that human error and bad judgment  
may have been instrumental in the death of my son, I think some  
soulight may be lighting the fog of environmental ignorance and the  
refusal of federal agencies to comply with federal environmental guide-  
lines.

This issue of contamination may impact many Marine families as  
I am not convinced that maximum efforts have been made to  
contact those Marines and their families that have resided on  
base and at Tarawa Terrace over the years. I believe all  
USMC oriented magazines/publications should make the issue known  
and that HQMC should issue an AWMAR to highlight the seriousness  
of the situation.
