The question does not appear to be directed, but might be read, to include all occasions on which I participated as a member of Congress, the North Carolina Senate and House, and the board of commissioners of Mecklenburg County, North Carolina, in any committee hearing, floor proceedings, or official meetings. That would be extremely voluminous and available in the public records of those institutions, although identifying and retrieving all responsive items for the latter three bodies would require hundreds or thousands of hours of review of untranscribed audio and/or video recordings. 
