3	SECTION 1. FINDINGS.
4	Congress makes the following findings:
5	(1) Voting by mail is a safe, secure, and suc-
6	cessful method for voters to participate in the demo-
7	cratic process.
8	(2) Voting by mail is commonplace and well-
9	tested in presidential elections. According to the
10	Election Assistance Commission, 23.7 percent of all

ballots in the 2016 presidential election were cast using vote by mail absentee voting. In five States—Colorado, Hawaii, Oregon, Utah, and Washington—voting by mail is the primary method of casting a ballot.

- (3) As States take precautions to prevent the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic, including during the election, voting-by-mail is a vital means of participating in the democratic process while keeping communities safe and healthy.
- (4) According to the Election Assistance Commission, voting-by-mail is an "essential part of the elections process for citizens away from home, such as our military and overseas voters," adding urgency to the need to ensure that members of our armed forces have the ability to vote.
- (5) According to the Select Committee on Intelligence of the Senate, during the 2016 presidential election, the Russian Internet Research Agency sought to suppress electoral participation, including through spreading "expressly voter suppressive content intended to dissuade African-American voters from participating in the 2016 presidential election." During the 2016 election, such disinformation was spread through paid advertisements, automated bots,

and front groups impersonating American citizens
on social media.

(6) According to a September 3, 2020, Department of Homeland Security bulletin, entitled "Russia Likely to Continue Seeking to Undermine Faith in US Electoral Process," Russia is "amplifying criticisms of vote-by-mail and shifting voting processes amidst the COVID-19 pandemic to undermine public trust in the electoral process." Further, the memo documents that Russian media have "denigrated vote-by-mail processes, alleging they lack transparency and procedural oversight, creating vast opportunities for voter fraud," and that the Department of Homeland Security assesses that "social media trolls are likely to promote allegations of corruption, system failure, and foreign malign interference to sow distrust in democratic institutions and election outcomes." Protecting and promoting participation in the November 3, 2020, election will require collaboration and cooperation from the social media companies.
