The Major Cities Chiefs Association, a professional organization of police executives representing the largest cities in the United States and Canada, endorses President Trump's nomination of Sara Carter to serve as Director of the Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP).

Our members are on the front lines of addressing the challenges of illicit drugs, substance abuse, and the violence and instability these issues bring to our communities. As such, the MCCA has long supported the role of ONDCP, especially in its support of High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) programs. Together, we have made strides in reducing youth drug use and disrupting the market for illegal drugs by dismantling drug trafficking organizations. Make no mistake, more work remains.
