5	(a) CERTIFICATION REQUIRED.—
6	(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after
7	the date of the enactment of this Act, and every 180
8	days thereafter, the Secretary, except as provided in
9	paragraph (2), shall submit written certification to
10	Congress that the Department has only deported or
11	otherwise removed a migrant from the United States

1	through an entry or exit point on the Southern bor-
2	der during daylight hours.
3	(2) Exception.—The certification required
4	under paragraph (1) shall not apply to the deporta-
5	tion or removal of a migrant otherwise described in

8	moval is justified by a compelling governmental
9	interest;

1	(b) Additional Information Required.—Not
2	later than 1 year after the date of the enactment of this
3	Act, the Secretary shall submit to Congress a study of the
4	Alien Transfer Exit Program, which shall include—
5	(1) the specific locations on the Southern bor-
6	der where lateral repatriations have occurred during
7	the 1-year period preceding the submission of the
8	study;
9	(2) the performance measures developed by
10	U.S. Customs and Border Protection to determine if
11	the Alien Transfer Exit Program is deterring mi-
12	grants from repeatedly crossing the border or other-
13	wise reducing recidivism; and
14	(3) the consideration given, if any, to the rates
15	of violent crime and the availability of infrastructure
16	and social services in Mexico near such locations.
17	(e) Prohibition on Confiscation of Prop-
18	ERTY.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, law-
19	ful, nonperishable belongings of a migrant that are con-
20	fiscated by personnel operating under Federal authority
21	shall be returned to the migrant before repatriation, to
22	the extent practicable.
