Dear Secretary Johnson and Director Comey:

In March of 2016, multiple new outlets reported that Joaquin "El Chapo" Guzman entered the United States twice in late 2015 to allegedly see his daughter in Southern California.¹ Apparently, Guzman was able to evade the elaborate manhunt by both the Mexican and U.S. authorities and enter the United States on two separate occasions. When asked about these news allegations², U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) responded that it had "no information that substantiates the claims in those news reports."

Yesterday, the Senate Committee on Finance held a hearing entitled, "Oversight of the U.S. Customs and Border Protection Agency," during which I asked Commissioner Kerlikowske yet again if the federal government had any knowledge that "El Chapo" entered the United States.³ Although the Commissioner promised that CBP "looked into that very thoroughly" he was unable to assure the Committee that it thoroughly vetted the allegation or possibility that El Chapo entered the country undetected. Further, Commissioner Kerlikowske admitted that he was unsure whether "El Chapo's" daughter had even been interviewed by authorities during the course of the investigation.
