RE: Shanlyn A.S. Park U.S. District Court Judicial Nominee for the District of Hawaii

Dear Senator Durbin and Senator Graham:

The Board of Directors of the Hawaii State Bar Association (HSBA) appreciates the opportunity to submit comments on the nomination of Shanlyn A.S. Park for the position of Judge of the U.S. District Court for the District of Hawaii.

Prior to informing a confirming authority of its findings on a judicial nominee, the HSBA Board of Directors follows a multi-step review process.

- Notification to the nominee of the HSBA appointment review process, which includes a questionnaire requesting educational credentials, legal and other professional work experiences, personal references; a resume; redacted copies of applications and questionnaires submitted to other entities; a form authorizing disclosure from the Hawaii Office of Disciplinary Counsel of any disciplinary action; and an interview with the HSBA Board of Directors in Honolulu.
- Notification via electronic transmission to the HSBA membership of the appointment and a request for comments on the nominee.
- Appointment of a three-person review Subcommittee of HSBA Board members by the HSBA President, which serves as a neutral fact-finding body to review documentation submitted by the nominee, contact references submitted by the nominee, review comments received from the HSBA membership, and conduct follow-up member contact for clarification, if necessary, for presentation to the HSBA Board.
- Submittal of a report by the three-person review Subcommittee to the HSBA President, and subsequently to the entire HSBA Board.
- Meeting of the HSBA President and the nominee prior to the scheduled interview of the nominee by the HSBA Board.

- Interview of the nominee by the HSBA Board.
- Deliberation of the HSBA Board which culminates in a qualified or unqualified vote.
- Submittal of the HSBA Board's recommendation to the confirming authority.

The HSBA President met with Ms. Park on September 25th to discuss the Subcommittee's findings. On September 26th, Ms. Park was interviewed by the HSBA Board of Directors in an executive session.

Documentation submitted by Ms. Park was reviewed and all the references listed were contacted for their personal opinions and observations. The comments and letters received from HSBA members reflected an affirmation of Ms. Park in all categories of the HSBA criteria which include:

- Integrity
- Diligence
- Legal knowledge and ability
- Professional experience
- Judicial temperament
- Financial responsibility
- Public service
- Ability to fulfill the responsibilities and duties of the position

Ms. Park has extensive litigation experience in both criminal and civil cases, and in both Federal and State Courts. In addition, she has served admirably as a State of Hawaii Circuit Court Judge and is well-respected by her peers. If confirmed, she will also be the first Native Hawaiian to be appointed to the Federal Court, which will help reflect the diversity of our State.

After the interview of the nominee, which included dialogue and questioning relating to her background, experiences, and reasons for pursuing the position of U.S. District Court Judge for the District of Hawaii, the Board of the Hawaii State Bar Association found Ms. Shanlyn A.S. Park to be **QUALIFIED**.¹

¹ Please note that, unlike the American Bar Association, the HSBA findings are limited to determining whether a nominee is "qualified" or "unqualified." We do not have other rankings such as "well qualified."
