On behalf of the National Council of La Raza (NCLR), the largest national Hispanic civil rights and advocacy organization in the United States, I write to express our strong support for Leon Rodriguez to be the next Director of United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) at the Department of Homeland Security.

Mr. Rodriguez has exhibited deft management skills, an extensive knowledge base, and a deep commitment to public service and law enforcement throughout his career. As a prosecutor for the Civil Rights Division of the U.S. Department of Justice, Rodriguez helped to spark national awareness of human trafficking by leading one of the first prosecutions of enslaved migrant agricultural workers.
