We write as current and former Mississippi Bar Association Presidents elected from North Mississippi and attorneys from the district to express our strong support for the nomination of James D. Maxwell II of Oxford, Mississippi, to the United States District Court for the Northern District of Mississippi.

Our two groups represent a wide range of political affiliations, legal practices, and judicial philosophies.
