Earlier in his career, Mr. Ali worked in private practice at Jenner & Block LLP and served as a law clerk for Justice Marshall Rothstein on the Supreme Court of Canada and Judge Raymond C. Fisher on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit. Mr. Ali received his J.D., magna cum laude, from Harvard Law School in 2011 and his B.S.E. from the University of Waterloo in Ontario, Canada, in 2008.
