During my time as Vice Chair of the United States Sentencing Commission, I have given speeches and lectures, spoken on panels, and participated in training and question-and-answer sessions. I have searched my files, the Commission’s files, and electronic databases to identify as many of those presentations as I am able. I typically did not speak from a prepared text, but as noted in the instructions to this question, I have provided, where available, any prepared texts, notes, outlines, and slides relating to these presentations. It is important to note that while these presentations are based on the materials provided, they may not reflect the exact words used during the presentations.

Since 1992, I have taught trial advocacy programs for practicing attorneys with the National Institute for Trial Advocacy. I have taught and helped coordinate such programs as a “Team Leader” and an “Assistant Team Leader” approximately 40 times. I have served as the Team Leader for the Western Regional Program’s annual seven-day course from 2004 to the present, the Team Leader for the Mid-Atlantic Program’s annual seven-day course from 1992 to 1994 and 1996 to the present, as well as the Team Leader for the National Program in 1995 and 2000. The court denied these motions. After a jury trial, Mr. Williams was convicted of capital murder. Based on evidence documenting our client's mental retardation, the United States withdrew its notice to pursue the death penalty before sentencing. Mr. Williams was sentenced to the mandatory sentence of life without the possibility of release.

3. *Clark v. City of Coatesville*, Cr. No. 03-1665 (E.D. Pa.) (Buckwalter, J.). Dates of Representation: 2003 – 2006.

Co-counsel and I represented Mr. Clark in a Section 1983 excessive force claim against police officers employed by the City of Coatesville. 4. *United States v. Hudson*, Cr. No. 04-297 (E.D. Pa.) (Savage, J.). Dates of Representation: August – December 2004

I was appointed to represent Mr. Hudson, who was charged with violating federal narcotics and firearms statutes in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania. Mr. Hudson was charged after police entered his brother's house and searched the second floor without requesting permission and without obtaining consent. Mr. Hudson was found on the second floor in a wheelchair next to a bed on which were money, a mirror, drugs and drug paraphernalia. Police also seized a locked security box under the bed and, after opening it pursuant to a search warrant, found that it contained firearms. To support a suppression motion, I secured the services of an investigator and subpoenaed an individual who was in custody on unrelated charges. I filed a motion to suppress arguing that the search and seizure violated the Fourth Amendment because the search was executed without a warrant and without consent, despite the fact that there were no exigent circumstances that would have excused the police from obtaining a warrant. Furthermore, I

argued that the evidence of firearms in the security box must be suppressed because the probable cause for the search warrant for the security box was based upon evidence seized during an illegal search. After a suppression hearing, the court agreed and suppressed the evidence. The government eventually dismissed the charges.

6. *United States v. Acosta*, Cr. No. 98-362 (E.D. Pa.) (Pollak, J.). Dates of Representation: 1999 – 2002

I was co-counsel for Mr. Acosta, who was one of 13 individuals charged in an indictment with murder in aid of racketeering and one of three defendants charged with capital murder. This was the first trial in a capital prosecution in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania. There was significant pretrial litigation on a wide variety of issues including but not limited to the admissibility of fingerprint evidence, severance of defendants, suppression of physical evidence, and the admissibility of tape recordings. Although the court initially ruled that fingerprint evidence was not reliable and therefore inadmissible, he reversed the ruling on the government's motion for reconsideration. The other motions also were denied. Mitigation efforts included, but were not limited to, traveling to Puerto Rico to interview family, friends and others in an

effort to prepare the penalty phase of the trial. After approximately six months of trial, the defendant pled guilty and received a sentence of life in prison.

8. *United States v. Cantero*, Cr. No. 96-245 (E.D. Pa.) (Bartle, J.). Dates of Representation: 1996 – 1997

I was counsel for Mr. Cantero, who was charged with a variety of violent offenses stemming from an armed car-jacking and kidnapping in which he was involved.
