Dear Chairman Grassley and Ranking Member Feinstein:

We are a bipartisan group of 81 Stanford Law School alumni who had the privilege of attending law school with Georgia Supreme Court Justice Britt Grant. We are writing to you in our personal capacities to express our support for Britt's nomination to the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit and respectfully urge you and your colleagues to vote for her confirmation.

At Stanford, Britt stood out as hard-working and incredibly intelligent. Britt was active on campus, helping to sponsor events where both sides of various legal debates were represented. From our earliest days at Stanford, it was clear that Britt had a keen intellect and a deep respect for the rule of law. Britt participated in class discussions and other debates around the law school, and she could always be counted on to contribute to any discussion with thoughtful and well-reasoned comments. Beyond her intellectual capacity, Britt is a kind and generous person who built many lasting friendships in law school. Many of us keep up with Britt and her family to this day.

None of her friends and classmates are surprised at Britt's success following graduation. Her performance in law school landed her toward the top of her class and secured a prestigious clerkship with the Honorable Brett M. Kavanaugh, on the Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit. After honing her skills at Kirkland and Ellis, public service called Britt home to Georgia, where she joined the Solicitor General's office, first as a Deputy Solicitor General before later being elevated to Solicitor. Finally, Britt was nominated to the Georgia Supreme Court, where she has served admirably. Despite her incredible accomplishments, Britt remains humble and down to earth – a cherished friend.

The undersigned group of individuals includes Republicans, Democrats, and independent voters who disagree on a number of issues. But we are united in urging the Judiciary Committee and the United States Senate to confirm Britt Grant to the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit. We believe that Britt has the right temperament to serve as an Article III Judge and that her respect for the rule of law will make her an excellent addition to the Eleventh Circuit. We respectfully urge her confirmation.
