Some law enforcement authorities (e.g. the Arizona Attorney General) even seem more interested in investigating my office (based on nonsense theories about how the 2020 election was stolen) than they do our persecutors.

It's not a great situation.

But I am blessed with an incredibly supportive county, a fantastic big brother who looks after me in our County Sheriff Paul Penzone, wonderful local police departments, and a vigilant Arizona Department of Homeland Security (among others).

Most of all, I am blessed with a wonderful team that is religiously committed to the preservation of democracy.

We will weather the storm. Our primary election has gone very well so far, and I'm confident we will see it through to the end.

Then on to November.
