Re: Nomination of Jennifer Sung to the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit

Dear Chairman Durbin and Ranking Member Grassley:

We write in enthusiastic support of Jennifer Sung's confirmation to the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit. Like Jennifer, we are former law clerks to the Honorable Betty Binns Fletcher of the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit. Although we are all former clerks of Judge Fletcher, we are diverse in our viewpoints, backgrounds, and careers. We include current and former federal and state appellate litigators, government attorneys and investigators, non-profit directors and practitioners, professors, prosecutors, public defenders, congressional staffers, corporate executives, and attorneys practicing in a wide variety of areas of law (commercial litigation, civil rights, Indian law, immigration, whistleblower protection, real estate, entertainment, labor, administrative law, and more). Despite our differences, we all firmly believe that Jennifer is an extraordinarily well-qualified nominee who deserves swift confirmation.

At every stage of her career, Jennifer has performed at the highest level. She is a seasoned litigator and a dedicated public servant. As a member of Oregon's Employment Relations Board, Jennifer has already immersed herself in the role of an adjudicator, demonstrating fairness, impartiality, and commitment to the law. Prior to becoming a member of the Board, Jennifer had a decade of experience practicing law with two law firms, litigating in state and federal courts. She is a distinguished graduate of Oberlin College and Yale Law School.

Jennifer is brilliant, hard-working, thoughtful, and deeply concerned about the effects of her work on the lives of litigants. Like Judge Fletcher, she stood out for her ability to focus on both the law and the facts—not just the dry facts in the legal briefs, but the perspectives of the people on both sides of a case. Jennifer's background as a child of immigrants, who understood the persecution her own grandparents had faced in their home country, and her experience before law school advocating for working people, have given her a depth of understanding of how legal structures affect individuals' lives that few elite lawyers possess.

We are all grateful for Judge Fletcher's thorough, analytical, compassionate, and collaborative approach to being a judge and to mentoring her clerks. In the same vein, we have no doubt that Jennifer will treat every litigant with respect, not just in the sense of being kind, but by giving her full attention and consideration to each litigant's arguments and perspective. We know that Jennifer will provide the same dedicated and patient mentorship to those lucky enough to clerk for her that Judge Fletcher gave us.

Jennifer will thrive as an appellate judge just as she excelled as an appellate clerk, attorney, and appellate Board member. She will be an inspiration to attorneys who appear before her, particularly attorneys who are women, people of color, and from immigrant families. The country needs more judges like Jennifer Sung, and we urge the Judiciary Committee and the Senate to promptly advance her nomination.
