We write to express our enthusiastic support for the nomination of Tiffany P. Cunningham to the United States Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit. As former law clerks of the Federal Circuit, we believe that Ms. Cunningham has the qualifications and the character to serve with distinction as a judge of that court.

The business of the Federal Circuit is unique among federal courts of appeals. With near-exclusive jurisdiction over patent cases, the Federal Circuit wields much influence over the country's innovation economy, from inventors and small businesses to large international corporations. We too served as law clerks at the Federal Circuit—some with Ms. Cunningham, others at different times or for different judges. Some of us know

Ms. Cunningham personally, others from professional circles, and others simply by her stellar reputation. We now hail from states across the nation, both political parties, and a variety of positions in business, private law practice, government, and academia.<sup>1</sup>

All of us agree that Ms. Cunningham is an excellent choice for Federal Circuit judge. Ms. Cunningham's clerkship at the court and her career in private practice well qualify her to perform the court's unique and important work. Those of us who know Ms. Cunningham personally believe she has the character—kind, collegial, inquisitive, and fair-minded—to serve with distinction and honor. As an added bonus, Ms. Cunningham would bring welcome diversity to the court as the first Black judge in its nearly forty-year history.

In sum, we believe Tiffany P. Cunningham has the qualifications and character to be an excellent judge of the Federal Circuit. We urge your committee to advance her nomination to the full Senate for confirmation.
