Dear Judge Boasberg,

As you may be aware, the Senate Judiciary Committee is investigating the Department of Justice's and the Federal Bureau of Investigation's handling of the application for FISA authority on Carter Page and three renewals thereof. I write to forward to the court the letter that I received today from Attorney General William P. Barr. This letter, and the attached summary, details what appear to be further failures on the part of the FBI to fully inform the court of all of the facts related to the probable cause determination for the Carter Page FISA applications. In particular, the summary appears to demonstrate that the Primary Sub-source for the Steele dossier, who supplied central and essential allegations for the Carter Page FISA applications, had previously been the subject of an FBI counterintelligence investigation into whether he was a Russian agent.

I feel that it is my duty to alert the court to this information so that it can consider it as part of its ongoing review of this matter.

Thank you for your attention to this important subject.
