The plaintiffs brought a declaratory judgment action asserting that Oklahoma's Funeral Service Licensing Act, which requires casket sellers located in Oklahoma to obtain funeral director licenses, violated the Fourteenth Amendment's Due Process and Equal Protection clauses. The district court denied relief. The decision was affirmed by the 10th Circuit.

On behalf of the FTC, I filed an amicus brief to correct errors regarding the defendant's characterization of the FTC's Funeral Rule as requiring local oversight of casket sales. The brief argued that Oklahoma's license requirement for casket sellers was not required by the FTC's Funeral Rule. The FTC did not file a brief on appeal.

2. *In re UPL Advisory Op. 2003-2*, 588 S.E.2d 741 (Ga. 2003) (per curiam).

The State Bar of Georgia petitioned the Georgia Supreme Court for review of an

opinion issued by the State Bar Association that prohibited as the unauthorized practice of law non-attorneys from preparing and executing a deed of conveyance. The Court upheld the opinion citing the state's long-standing tradition of requiring attorneys to close real estate transactions.

On behalf of the FTC, and together with the Department of Justice, I filed an amicus brief which argued that non-attorney real estate closing are common in most states and the opinion issued by the Georgia Bar would have negative impacts on consumers by increasing prices and reducing choice in real estate closing services.

3. *McMahon v. Advanced Title Svcs. Co. of West Virginia*, 607 S.E. 2d 519 (W. Va. 2004).

A consumer filed a class action lawsuit against a real estate company for the unauthorized practice of law, alleging the company misled consumers into believing attorneys conducted the closing services. The trial court granted partial summary judgment in favor of the plaintiff and certified to the West Virginia Supreme Court several questions of law including whether providing real estate title and closing services constitutes the unauthorized practice of law when no attorney is involved. The Court held that the plaintiff had standing to bring a cause of action alleging unlawful practice of law in state court and remanded to develop a fuller factual record.

On behalf of the FTC, I filed an amicus brief arguing that consumers benefit from non-attorneys performing real estate settlement services, which is the common practice in most states. If the court were to find that these services constituted the unauthorized practice of law, it would increase prices and reduce competition without countervailing benefits.

4. *Cleveland Bar Ass'n v. CompManagement, Inc.*, 818 N.E.2d 1181 (Ohio 2004).

A large actuarial service company represented clients before Ohio's Industrial Commission on matters of worker's compensation. The plaintiff, Cleveland Bar Association, challenged this representation as the unauthorized practice of law. The Supreme Court of Ohio held that merely representing a party before the Industrial Commission was not the practice of law, relying on two grounds. First, laypersons historically presented before the Industrial Commission on worker's compensation claims. Second, the public interest weighed in favor of allowing laypersons to present on worker's compensation claims.

On behalf of the FTC, I filed an amicus brief which argued that the Court should balance the benefits from competition against any harm that results from non-attorney representation. The brief concluded that prohibiting lay representation before the Industrial Commission was an over-restrictive measure that harmed consumers through increased prices and reduced choice without countervailing benefits.

5. *In re Op. 39 of the Comm. on Attorney Adver.*, 961 A.2d 722 (N.J. 2008) (per curiam).

The New Jersey Committee on Attorney Advertising found that a magazine that advertised attorneys using terms like “Super Lawyers,” and “Best Lawyers in America,” violated the New Jersey Rules of Professional Conduct. The New Jersey Supreme Court held that the advertisements were protected under the First Amendment. The Court held that, in the absence of evidence that the advertisements were misleading, the Committee opinion banned truthful and fact-based claims and was unconstitutional.

On behalf of the FTC, I filed an amicus brief which argued that restricting fact-based claims in attorney advertising would harm consumers and failed to comply with the First Amendment commercial speech doctrine. The brief highlighted how advertising can lower transaction costs for consumers. It also alleged that restriction was not narrowly tailored to further a government interest in preventing misleading commercial speech.

In addition to the amicus briefs discussed above, FTC Commissioners play an

active role in agency litigation. To initiate litigation after a staff investigation, the Commissioners review the extensive evidence gathered, such as declarations by possible defendants and other witnesses, business records, and economic expert reports. The Commissioners assess the relevant federal case law, including precedent in particular circuits and the Supreme Court. The Commissioners then vote to issue a complaint, determining what law violations to allege and in what forum to proceed (federal court versus administrative litigation). For federal court litigation, the Commissioners supervise subsequent appeals, including before the Supreme Court.

For administrative litigation, if there is an appeal after a trial and decision by an administrative law judge, the Commissioners play a quasi-judicial role. They review the administrative law judge's legal and factual rulings through briefs and oral argument. The Commissioners then decide the appeal and issue a written decision. These decisions are appealable to any of the U.S. Courts of Appeal and ultimately the Supreme Court.

6. *N.C. State Bd. of Dental Exam'rs v. FTC*, 135 S. Ct. 1101 (2015)

The FTC issued an administrative complaint alleging that the state dental board in North Carolina engaged in unfair methods of competition in violation the FTC Act by blocking non-dentists from providing teeth-whitening services. An FTC Administrative Law Judge held that the Dental Board's action constituted an unreasonable restraint of trade and an unfair method of competition. The Commission denied the respondent's motion to dismiss, ruling that the Board's actions were not entitled to state action immunity because the Board is controlled by practicing dentists and its conduct was not actively supervised by the state. The Commission then issued an opinion concluding that the Dental Board violated the FTC Act. The U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit denied the Board's petition to review the Commission's decision. The Supreme Court affirmed the ruling of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit, concluding that the Dental Board was not entitled to state action immunity.

7. *McWane, Inc. v. FTC*, 783 F.3d 814 (11th Cir. 2015)

The FTC filed separate complaints against the three largest U.S. suppliers of ductile iron pipe fittings, charging that the three companies – McWane, Inc., Star Pipe Products, Ltd., and Sigma Corporation – illegally conspired to set and maintain prices for pipe fittings, and that McWane illegally maintained its monopoly power in the market for U.S.-made pipe fittings by implementing an exclusive dealing policy. Sigma and Star settled the FTC’s charges prior to litigation. The FTC’s Chief Administrative Law Judge dismissed charges that McWane illegally conspired with its competitors to raise and stabilize prices but found that McWane violated the antitrust laws when it excluded competitors from the market. The FTC (Chairwoman Ramirez, Commissioners Brill, Ohlhausen) issued a decision finding that McWane unlawfully maintained its monopoly in the domestic fittings market (Commissioner Wright dissented on this count). The Eleventh Circuit upheld the Commission’s order.

8. *POM Wonderful, LLC v. FTC*, 777 F.3d 478 (D.C. Cir. 2015).

The FTC filed an administrative complaint charging that POM and related parties had made false, misleading, and unsubstantiated representations in violation of the FTC Act. The FTC Chief Administrative Law Judge's decision held that the POM marketers made false or deceptive advertising claims in certain ads. The Commission (liability opinion by Commissioner Ohlhausen, dissenting on remedy) issued an opinion upholding liability and requiring two controlled clinical trials for future claims. The D.C. Circuit upheld the FTC decision on liability but agreed with Commissioner Ohlhausen regarding the remedy. The FTC's blanket requirement (at least two randomized controlled clinical studies as a precondition to any disease-related claim) was an undue burden on speech.

9. In re LabMD, Inc., 2016 FTC LEXIS 128 (F.T.C. July 28, 2016) *appeal pending* (11th Cir. 16-16270).

The FTC filed a complaint against LabMD, asserting that the company engaged in unfair practice because it failed to take reasonable steps to protect consumers' medical data, leading to the breach of such data. The FTC's Administrative Law Judge found that the company was not liable. The Commission overturned the ALJ decision, holding that the ALJ had applied the wrong legal standard for unfairness, and the Commission (Chairwoman Ramirez with Ohlhausen and McSweeney joining) concluded that the unreasonable actions taken by LabMD constituted an unfair business practice. This case is on appeal to U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals for the 11th Circuit.

10. *ECM BioFilms, Inc. v. FTC*, 851 F.3d 599 (6th Cir. 2017).

ECM BioFilms manufactures an additive that it claims accelerates the rate at which plastic biodegrades. The FTC filed an administrative complaint against ECM, alleging that several of its biodegradability claims were deceptive. The FTC's Chief Administrative Law Judge held that the company violated the FTC Act by deceptively claiming, and providing others with the means to claim, that plastics treated with ECM additives would completely biodegrade in a landfill within nine months to five years, and that tests proved this claim. ECM appealed the decision in regards to biodegradable claims that made without reference to any timeframe. The Commission affirmed the decision (Opinion by Commissioner McSweeney, with Ramirez, Ohlhausen and Brill joining). ECM appealed the Commission's decision with regard to only one of the claims, arguing that it was unsupported by substantial evidence. ECM also contended that the Commission violated its rights under the First Amendment, the Administrative Procedures Act, and the Due Process Clause of the Fifth Amendment. The U.S. Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit upheld the FTC's decision in full.

As an attorney advisor with Commissioner Orson Swindle for three years, I evaluated numerous antitrust enforcement matters and a wide variety of consumer protection enforcement actions. During my tenure at the Office of Policy Planning, I helped develop Commission positions on a number of cutting-edge legal issues, such as barriers to e-commerce, restraints on advertising, and the impact of new technologies on consumer protection and competition law. I co-authored several important legal policy reports, including the FTC's Report of the State Action Task Force (2003), and Enforcement Perspectives on the *Noerr-Pennington* Doctrine (2006), which laid the foundation for the FTC's two wins before the Supreme Court on the state action doctrine and success in district court on challenging repetitive petitioning. My over 17 years of work at the FTC, the primary U.S. consumer protection agency, has allowed me to help protect the most vulnerable consumers from frauds, scams, unfair debt collection tactics, predatory lending, and a host of other unfair and deceptive business practices. In 2017, as Acting Chairman of the FTC, I launched enforcement and education efforts focused on aiding military consumers, who face particular challenges from frequent deployments, as well as small businesses, which may lack the knowledge and resources to protect themselves from scams. During my tenure as Acting Chairman, I have also increased the agency's efforts against phantom debt collection and other abusive lending practices, culminating in the recent "Game of Loans" multi-case sweep in cooperation with a number of state attorneys general.

President Trump designated me Acting Chairman of the FTC in January 2017. As Acting FTC Chairman, in the spring of 2017 I had several discussions with staff in the White House Counsel's Office and in the Office of Presidential Personnel about the selection of a permanent FTC Chairman. In the summer of 2017, as part of these continuing discussions, I mentioned my long-term goal of being a judge and asked to be considered for such a position. I subsequently sent my resume to the White House Counsel staff by email.

On August 28, White House Counsel staff contacted me about scheduling a judicial interview. I participated in an interview with attorneys from the White House Counsel's Office and the Justice Department's Office of Legal Policy on September 21, 2017. On October 12, 2017, a staff member in the Office of the White House Counsel staff informed me that the White House wanted to nominate me to the Court of Federal Claims. On October 26, staff from the Justice Department Office of Legal Policy emailed me with instructions for completing this questionnaire and the relevant forms to complete. I met with Legislative Counsel at the Executive Office for US Attorneys in November 2017 regarding background vetting. I subsequently contacted the White House Counsel's Office by phone and email for status updates in December 2017 and January 2018. The White House Counsel's office informed me by email on

January 22, 2018, that my nomination was imminent and informed me by phone on January 23, 2018, that the intent to nominate would be released that afternoon.
