b. Describe:

- i. the general character of your law practice and indicate by date when its character has changed over the years.

From 1999 to 2002, as a Field Attorney at the NLRB, I investigated alleged violations of the National Labor Relations Act. Overwhelmingly, these violations involved an employer interfering with employees' ability to discuss and take action regarding their wages, hours, and working conditions.

I investigated unfair labor practices ranging from failure to bargain, strikes and lockouts, to threats and unlawful terminations. As one of the few attorneys of color in the office, I frequently received the cases involving low-income immigrants of color. These were often the most egregious violations, with allegations that employers threatened to have their employees or workers deported if they asked for their paycheck, or about the raise they had been promised, or for a fan in a sweltering hot basement where they worked all summer.

As an associate and then Counsel at Bingham McCutchen from 2002 to 2007, I worked in the litigation section of the firm, specializing in labor and employment matters, as well as complex civil litigation, First Amendment issues, and criminal defense. I was also selected to serve a

rotation as a Special Assistant District Attorney for the Plymouth County District Attorney's Office. At Bingham, I represented individuals who received federal grand jury subpoenas. I frequently defended corporations after their employment decisions resulted in litigation. We also represented several newspapers and assisted with all of their legal matters, from negotiating collective bargaining agreements and handling arbitrations to unsealing search warrant affidavits and handling employment matters and administrative appeals. Additionally, I routinely handled litigation involving strikes and union organizing campaigns, as well as determining the labor consequences or obligations after mergers or acquisitions. My practice at Seyfarth Shaw was very similar but did not include any criminal litigation.

From 2007 to 2011, I served as an Assistant United States Attorney for the District of Massachusetts, focusing on federal civil enforcement, criminal prosecutions, civil defense litigation, and appeals. I started my work in the Civil Division handling affirmative and defensive matters involving immigration, employment, health care fraud, environmental issues, qui tam litigation, social security claims, civil commitments, the False Claims Act, the Federal Tort Claims Act, Bivens, Touhy, and asset forfeiture matters. In the Criminal Division, I worked with both the OCDETF and Public Corruption & Special Prosecutions Units.

I was selected to serve on a small team of attorneys in our office handling civil commitment trials for sexually dangerous persons under the Adam Walsh Act. Massachusetts and North Carolina were the only jurisdictions in the country handling these types of cases at the time. Every case I prosecuted resulted in the sexually dangerous person remaining detained, rendering them unable to re-offend and harm.

I prosecuted several money laundering and asset forfeiture-related matters, civil and criminal health care fraud and procurement fraud matters, and defended the government and its agents when sued. I also investigated and prosecuted civil rights cases involving housing, employment, veterans' rights under the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (USERRA), and disability rights violations.

From 2011 and 2013, I was the General Counsel of the Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT) and the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority (MBTA), and from 2013 to 2015, I was the Chief Legal Counsel at the Massachusetts Port Authority (Massport). I focused on complex civil litigation, criminal prosecutions, regulatory compliance, transportation issues, and corporate governance. One of my many responsibilities was overseeing all labor negotiations at MassDOT and the MBTA, and all terminations at each of the three entities, covering nearly 20,000 workers in total. I oversaw a high volume of complex

I lead an office of over 300 people, at 14 different work locations, handling approximately 25,000 new cases per year, with an annual budget of nearly \$25 million. I am deeply involved in the impact litigation and prosecutions pursued by my office, particularly hate crimes, domestic violence, child abuse, rapes, violence against women and other protected classes, any cases involving a wiretap, officer-involved shootings and allegations of excessive force by law enforcement, homicides, and claims of wrongful conviction. I personally approve each charging decision or change of plea made in any murder case, and review and approve any internal request for the use of wiretaps for long-term investigations. Additionally, I am briefed at least weekly on the work of our specialized units and progress on major cases. I am also deeply involved in impact appellate litigation and frequently review, significantly alter, or write appellate briefs regarding seminal issues.

During my tenure as District Attorney, our office assented to a Motion for New Trial to achieve a just outcome in the case of Mr. Foxworth, a wrongfully-convicted man serving a life sentence for a murder he maintained, even after nearly 30 years of

incarceration, that he did not commit. This case languished in the office for years prior to my administration, and Mr. Foxworth's motion likely would have been opposed had I not been elected. At every step of my office's review of this case, I was intimately involved in litigation strategy, edited every major filing in the case, and made the decision, as District Attorney, to fight for Mr. Foxworth's immediate release.

Our team's investigation of Mr. Foxworth's case revealed egregious constitutional and ethical violations, as well as potentially criminal conduct by law enforcement, which severely impacted the integrity of Mr. Foxworth's conviction and pointed to his innocence. After reviewing all of the evidence, I made the decision to assent to his Motion for New Trial.

When the Superior Court judge overseeing Mr. Foxworth's case refused to schedule a hearing on his assented-to Motion for New Trial, our team filed an emergency petition in the Supreme Judicial Court in order to effectuate Mr. Foxworth's release from custody as soon as possible. Just two days before Christmas 2020, Justice Scott Kafker agreed with us and stayed Mr. Foxworth's sentence, over the objection of the Trial Court. He was released that day.

I have rarely been more satisfied over the course of 20 years of practicing law than I was when, sharing the holidays with my family, I knew that Mr. Foxworth was able to do the same. On January 13, 2021, newly-assigned Judge Robert Ullmann of the Superior Court granted Mr. Foxworth's assented-to Motion for New Trial. Within hours of the decision, my office entered a *nolle prosequi*, formally ending the prosecution of Mr. Foxworth.

On March 17, 2021, I authored the pleading on behalf of the Commonwealth in support of a Motion for New Trial by Sean Ellis, the subject of Netflix’s “Trial 4” documentary. Mr. Ellis was tried three separate times to secure convictions for the murder and armed robbery of Boston Police Detective John James Mulligan (in trial three), as well as possession of a firearm (trial one). The first and second trials resulted in hung juries regarding the murder and armed robbery charges. Years after the third trial, the United States Attorney’s Office for the District of Massachusetts prosecuted three BPD detectives for intricate criminal schemes involving robbing drug dealers and lying about confidential informants, among other nefarious deeds. It was also determined, unfortunately, that the deceased victim, Detective Mulligan, had participated in these criminal schemes with his colleagues. The three living detectives had interjected themselves into nearly every aspect of the investigation into Mulligan’s murder, contaminating it from root to tip.

In 2015, a Superior Court Judge granted Mr. Ellis’s Motion for New Trial as to the armed robbery (of the gun) and murder (with the gun), but not on the firearm charges (the gun). The first two indictments were ultimately dropped by my predecessor in 2018, two weeks prior to my taking office. In late 2020, the instant Motion for New Trial requested the same relief for the remaining firearm conviction. Due to the massive police corruption and prosecutorial misconduct that had been laid out in exhaustive detail by the U.S. Attorney’s Office, the Superior Court, and the Supreme Judicial Court, as well as several BPD Internal Affairs and Anti-Corruption investigations, I alone made the decision to assent to the motion. On May 4, 2021, a Superior Court judge agreed and granted the request for a new trial. The following day, our office dismissed the remaining charges and put an end to one of the most notorious cases—and wrongful convictions—in the history of our great city.

Beginning in 2012, the Massachusetts criminal legal system was rocked by a systemic failure of extraordinary scale. The public learned that two state drug lab chemists, Annie Dookhan and Sonja Farak, had committed egregious misconduct in the course of their work, tainting the credibility of tens of thousands of convictions and throwing the legal system into crisis. Determined litigation by defense attorneys ultimately secured relief to thousands of defendants in the years prior to my taking office. This misconduct is laid out in detail in Netflix’s “How to Fix a Drug Lab Scandal” documentary.

At the beginning of my tenure as District Attorney, many observers may have assumed that the crisis was over. However, my team’s analysis quickly revealed that prior attempts to address the systemic breakdown that allowed this misconduct to occur were not sufficient to ensure that justice was done for every impacted defendant. I directed that my office take action in the Bridgeman and Escobar matters to rectify the errors of the past.

In the Bridgeman filing, we moved to secure the dismissal of cases against over 100 so-called “List Three” defendants—individuals whose prosecutions had been maintained by my predecessor despite the involvement of disgraced chemist Dookhan in their cases. I directed my office to collaborate with defense bar partners to efficiently and accurately resolve this matter before Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court Justice Frank Gaziano, the Special Master handling these scandals. On June 25, 2021, Justice Gaziano accepted the joint request by the Commonwealth and defense bar partners, and vacated and dismissed charges against these defendants.

In the Escobar filing, I went further, announcing my intention to vacate all convictions predicated on drug analysis performed at the state’s mismanaged, unsupervised, and now closed Hinton Laboratory during the period when either Dookhan or Farak worked there. To structure the work of securing relief for the tens of thousands of affected defendants, I created the Hinton Lab Initiative, a dedicated unit in my office focused on preventing and addressing systemic breakdowns and

securing relief to Hinton Lab defendants. By building collaborative relationships with stakeholders from every corner of the criminal legal system, we will develop protocols and mechanisms to ensure that a systemic breakdown at this scale never happens again.

This case marked a key test of the immigration policy I implemented as District Attorney. I was intimately involved in this case as our team worked to avert disastrous immigration consequences for the defendant, an effort that ultimately involved bringing the case before the Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court. I directed my team to work with defense counsel to craft a just solution in Mr. Bilal's case and spoke out strongly against certain draconian impacts of our nation's immigration system under the Trump Administration.

Two days after Osman Bilal was born in Somalia, his family fled to Saudi Arabia. Mr. Bilal entered the United States as a refugee when he was still a child. At the age of 19 years old, Mr. Bilal committed a series of crimes. He took responsibility for his actions and paid his debt to society. Some seven years later, deportation proceedings were pursued against him. The misdemeanor that my predecessor had allowed Mr. Bilal to plea to, larceny under \$250, is considered a crime of "moral turpitude" and carries immigration consequences far out of proportion to its seriousness. Mr. Bilal, now 27 years old, was a gainfully employed taxpayer; he had glowing recommendations from his employer, where he worked 50-60 hours a week as a sous chef, and from More Than Words, a non-profit that he interacted with significantly. Yet, he faced deportation to a war-torn country where he had spent only 48 hours

over two decades ago.

After a municipal court judge granted a Motion for New Trial to which we assented, we immediately entered a *nolle prosequi* in order to forestall the unduly severe immigration consequences in this case. Several days later, a trial court Judge tried to reinstate the case. We filed an emergency petition with the Supreme Judicial Court, and Justice Lowy ruled in our favor, allowing Mr. Bilal to proceed with his life in the United States, as American as any of us.

These cases arise out of an incident in which Mr. Khan, a Special Police Officer, punched an 11-year-old child in the face after he saw her shoplifting in a Boston department store. Initially, prosecutors in our office contemplated pursuing shoplifting charges against the 11-year-old child. Instead, I directed that my team take a deeper look at Mr. Khan, a decision that ultimately led to the discovery of Mr. Khan's prior history of violent conduct with the company.

Due to recent changes in the law, the juvenile victim in this case could not have been

prosecuted for any crime. Further, the investigation I ordered revealed that Mr. Khan had been “reprimanded” at least four previous times for ignoring orders and/or using more force than was necessary or permitted in violation of protocols set out by his employer, Securitas, which is responsible for the security within the department store. I directed the case to move forward and on November 20, 2019, a grand jury returned indictments against Mr. Khan for Assault and Battery on a Child Under 14 Years Old and one count of a Civil Rights Violation. His case is currently awaiting trial.

I also instructed our office to pursue charges against Securitas, the company that employed Mr. Khan and kept sending him back to work with the public after he continued to use more force than was necessary or permitted. The grand jury returned indictments against Securitas—for the same crimes as Mr. Khan—under the theory of Criminal Corporate Liability. This theory allows corporations to be held responsible for the criminal actions of their employees. This was one of the very few times that this theory has been utilized by a District Attorney in Massachusetts. On May 5, 2021, a Superior Court judge approved a statewide consent agreement by Securitas that would require them to provide and implement de-escalation and implicit bias training, written zero tolerance policies, and record retention requirements, among several other things. This historic agreement applies to all 292 locations throughout Massachusetts where Securitas operates.

Ultimately, the deeper investigation that I ordered and directed my team to undertake transformed a potential juvenile shoplifting case into a historic settlement agreement that will help to keep patrons safe in hundreds of venues across Massachusetts.

During my service as an Assistant United States Attorney, I worked on a case involving a Chinese national, Mr. Hiu Lui Ng, who was detained while awaiting deportation and began complaining of pain. His complaints were ignored by prison guards and medical staff, and he was mocked and called a liar. After months of complaining of now excruciating pain, Mr. Ng finally secured a hearing before a federal judge. The day the judge saw Mr. Ng, he immediately ordered that Mr. Ng be brought to see a doctor outside of the carceral facility. Mr. Ng was diagnosed with terminal liver cancer and had a fractured spine and severe bruising. He died five days later.

Our office represented several ICE Agents in a Bivens matter filed by Mr. Ng's widow, Lin Li Qu. The agents had briefly interacted with Mr. Ng. before his death. This was one of the most heart-wrenching matters I worked on in during my time at the USAO, and involved frequent reporting to and oversight from the Department of Justice. The case had nearly 30 named defendants and required extensive discovery and motion practice prior to reaching settlement with Ms. Qu.

Shortly after joining Bingham McCutchen as an associate in 2002, I began working on a pro bono matter brought to the Lawyers Committee for Civil Rights by the Massachusetts Association of Minority Law Enforcement Officers (MAMLEO) involving nine individuals who were either Boston Police Officers or applicants for employment. Each individual claimed that they had received a false positive indicating cocaine use after taking the Boston Police Department's required hair test. Each had a near contemporaneous "negative" test result from an accredited testing facility. All maintained their innocence.

I was the first associate who worked on this case, and immediately recognized the seriousness of the matter. Over its long procedural history, this litigation has made significant, and even multiple stops in some instances, at the Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination, the Civil Service Commission, the Superior Court, the Massachusetts Appeals Court, the Supreme Judicial Court, the United States District Court, and the United States Court of Appeals for the First Circuit. The underlying claims allege that the test is unreliable and the difference between hair test exam results by race establish a disparate impact on Black test takers.

The Civil Service Commission, the Superior Court, and the Supreme Judicial Court have all issued opinions ruling against the City of Boston and strongly questioning the reliability of the now "controversial" hair testing technique utilized and condoned by BPD. A First Circuit panel has also ruled in favor of one of the officer's claims.

This case served as a major test of my keystone policy of prosecutorial discretion. It began during the “Straight Pride Parade” in September 2019. Law enforcement made a number of arrests. My office reviewed each case and determined, consistent with the new policies implemented through the Rollins Memo (*supra*), that the violent and serious cases would be arraigned in the ordinary course, and the non-violent, non-serious cases, which effectively punished people for exercising their First Amendment rights, would likely be diverted, dismissed, or we would enter a *nolle prosequi*.

Judge Richard Sinnott of the Boston Municipal Court refused to allow the Commonwealth to enter a *nolle prosequi* on Mr. Webber’s case, instead arraigning him over the Commonwealth’s objection. The following day, Judge Sinnott did the same thing and then held defense attorney Susan Church in contempt and placed her in a holding cell for several hours after she tried to explain the centuries of case law upholding the power of prosecutorial discretion and the separation of powers.

In what quickly became a high-profile incident, I led my office’s response and directed our litigation in opposition to the Judge’s actions. I quickly directed my team to file an emergency petition with the Supreme Judicial Court. Justice Gaziano ruled in our favor, finding that the Commonwealth holds—and has held for centuries—the unilateral power to enter a *nolle prosequi* and end a prosecution, and that this power could not be restricted by the judiciary, as it would violate the separation of powers. Justice Gaziano reinstated the *nolle prosequi* we filed and further expunged Mr.

Webber's criminal record so the arraignment was permanently removed.

During my service as an Assistant United States Attorney, I worked on several cases involving the civil commitment of sexually dangerous persons under the Adam Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act. This specific case involved a defendant who had been convicted of multiple sex offenses against children. Our office successfully argued that the defendant was sexually dangerous and should be committed for further treatment in order to protect the community. Along with co-counsel, I prosecuted the defendant in a seven-day bench trial before Judge Patti B. Saris, ultimately resulting in his further commitment.

At the time, the Office of the United States Attorney for the District of Massachusetts was one of only two jurisdictions in the country conducting this crucially important litigation.

I have not acted as a lobbyist. As to the most significant legal activities I have undertaken, the following ten (10) are particularly meaningful:

- Arnold King was 18 years old when, in 1971, he murdered John Labanara in the course of attempting to rob him. Mr. Labanara's life was violently cut short on the very day he passed the bar exam. He was a deeply committed public servant who was then working as an advance man for the campaign of Boston's Mayor Kevin White. Mr. King was indicted for first degree murder in November of that same year. When the case proceeded to trial, the office that I now lead maintained an unwritten but well-known practice of striking every Black juror at the trial of any cross-racial murder. Accordingly, an all-white jury convicted Mr. King in Suffolk Superior Court in 1972, and he was sentenced to life in prison without the possibility of parole. Almost half a century later, we determined that Mr. King had not received a fair trial due to these profoundly unjust jury practices, and worked with his counsel to craft a just solution. In October 2019, we ultimately decided to reduce the verdict to manslaughter, an outcome that would maintain Mr. King's accountability for a murder he admitted to having committed, while holding the office I now lead accountable for an unconstitutional and unethical breach. I personally spoke with the Labanara family and informed them of my decision. Mr. King left prison a profoundly different man than when he entered, almost 50 years before. He has rejoined society as a widely-respected community leader whose mentorship and support has helped hundreds of fellow inmates to become better versions of themselves. At the hearing that ended his prosecution, Mr. King apologized

to the friends and family of Mr. Labanara, and recognized that while he could never take back what he did, he had a responsibility to continue giving back to the community for as long as he could.

- On March 27, 2020, my office moved to join the Committee for Public Counsel Services (CPCS), the Commonwealth's public defender agency, and the Massachusetts Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers (MACDL) in an emergency petition filed pursuant to G.L. c. 211 § 3 and advocating for the immediate release of non-violent pre-trial detainees from carceral facilities due to the heightened risk of COVID-19 exposure. In a time of profound crisis for our state and nation, our office helped to lead the way in protecting incarcerated community members who were uniquely vulnerable to the virus. I am proud of the balance we struck between prioritizing public health and maintaining public safety.
- On August 4, 2020, I wrote to Massachusetts Governor Charles Baker urging him to diversify our Commonwealth's Supreme Judicial Court, Judicial Nominating Commission, Superior Court, and several other selection committees or stakeholders in the criminal legal system that do not adequately reflect the communities and people most often coming into contact with the legal system. The letter is attached *supra* at answer 12(c). Our Governor has selected exceptional and diverse Justices to lead and serve, and we now likely have one of the most diverse state supreme courts in America.
- In October 2019, my office charged a young woman named Inyoung You with manslaughter for her actions, and inactions, in the May 20, 2019 suicide of her boyfriend. She is accused of domestic violence in a toxic college relationship that involved at-times near-constant psychological, emotional, and verbal abuse, much of it through text messages. This matter is on the leading edge of pressing debates about relationship violence in the digital age. The case is currently involved in complex appellate litigation in advance of a potential trial.
- In early 2019, at the very beginning of my administration, I was adamant that our office move forward and file litigation in federal court against ICE. As a result, we jointly filed a preliminary injunction that was granted, making Massachusetts the first state in the nation where ICE could no longer make civil or administrative arrests of people walking in and around state courthouses. The lawsuit had been contemplated for nearly two years prior to my election. After the FBI arrested Judge Shelley Joseph, many of the other potential plaintiffs in the ICE litigation were scared and wanted to delay further. I explained the urgency of this moment and that we needed to file. Thankfully, we did. On June 20, 2019, U.S. District Judge Talwani granted the Preliminary Injunction, blocking ICE from further engaging in behavior that prevents communities from accessing the criminal legal system. Although the First Circuit Court of Appeals later determined that Judge Talwani had abused her discretion in granting the preliminary injunction, our litigation resulted in a period of well over a year in which ICE could not make those types of arrests in and around our courthouses. This allowed many community members who feared potential deportation, and thus avoided the criminal legal system, to finally access the services and support they needed (e.g., restraining orders or mental health and substance abuse disorder assistance). The Biden Administration recently promulgated ICE policies that are consistent with the positions

espoused in our litigation.

- From 2017 to 2018, I had the pleasure of serving as the Chair of Legal Redress for the Boston Branch of the NAACP. This volunteer position allowed me to interact closely with the Boston community and better understand their specific pain points. Many of the complaints and inquiries I received involved the criminal legal system, from overzealous, unethical, or unconstitutional arrests and prosecutions to multiple complaints about non-responsive or unavailable defense attorneys. I met with the then-Suffolk County District Attorney, on behalf of the NAACP, about many concerns within our community. Those concerns and my request for answers and change frequently went unanswered. We have and are implementing the changes I requested in the office I now lead. The Discharge Integrity Team, Integrity Review Bureau, Project for Unsolved Suffolk Homicides, and the Rollins Memo are some examples of those changes.
- As the Chief Legal Counsel of Massport, I worked closely with the CEO and Board on the Headquarters Hotel deal, an \$800M real estate transaction. I handled every legal aspect of this transaction, including giving diversity equal weight to the three other selection criteria for the project for the first time in the history of our Commonwealth. This process would later become known as the “Massport Model,” and is now celebrated as a cutting-edge tool for including equity considerations in major real estate transactions across the Commonwealth and nation.
- On May 31, 2014, a private G4 jet attempting to depart from Hanscom Air Field crashed, killing all seven passengers on board. Massport owns and operates Hanscom Air Field. For the next 15 months, as the Chief Legal Counsel of Massport, I oversaw every internal and external investigation involving the crash. I routinely briefed the CEO, the Massport Board, and over 30 stakeholders and putative defendants during the extensive NTSB investigation. I prepared and led the Massport team that presented to the NTSB in Washington, D.C., handled significant interactions with our insurance carrier, secured outside counsel and consultants, oversaw all national litigation, and worked directly with the CEO to implement changes as a result of the multiple investigations.
- During my service as an Assistant United States Attorney, I worked on the investigation of a massive online gambling ring called “Sports Offshore.” The ring, based in Antigua, employed approximately 50 gambling agents in the United States, who had hundreds of customers. We believed the gambling business had laundered more than \$10 million in checks and wire transfers utilizing an Antiguan Internet site and employing gambling agents in Massachusetts and Florida. The office had secured a 442-count federal indictment against multiple defendants containing racketeering (RICO) charges, racketeering conspiracy, operating an illegal gambling business, money laundering, filing false tax returns, and interstate travel in aid of racketeering and wire act offenses. This case, USA v. Lyons et al., involved the first group of defendants in the United States charged and convicted of violating the Unlawful Internet Gambling Enforcement Act (UIGEA). The statute was enacted by Congress in 2006 to deter the use of the U.S. banking system to pay internet gambling debts incurred by U.S. citizens. I worked on this case with the Chief of the Public Corruption and Special Prosecutions Unit Fred Wyshak. I left the USAO to become the General Counsel of

the MBTA a few weeks before the trial began.

- During my service as an Assistant United States Attorney, I worked with both the OCDETF and Public Corruption & Special Prosecutions Units in the Criminal Division of our office. In OCDETF, I worked closely with federal, state, and local law enforcement investigating gun trafficking and narcotics sales in the Boston and Brockton areas. I reviewed all of the recorded undercover purchases by cooperating witnesses and undercover agents and officers and presented the case to the grand jury. Every case was indicted. After securing arrest warrants, 32 individuals were arrested and 47 illegal, unregistered firearms were removed from our community. I handled and resolved several of the resulting cases.

From 2012 to 2018, I served as a returning faculty member for Harvard Law School's Trial Advocacy Workshop (TAW). TAW is an intensive three-week trial advocacy program culminating in a full simulated trial with mock jurors. TAW students are instructed and critiqued by a faculty of experienced lawyers and judges. Faculty are asked to teach for one of the three weeks. I have located seven (7) course descriptions for various TAW semesters from 2012 to 2018. While I may not have taught during each of these semesters, I have included all of them in order to best guide the committee as to the nature of the Workshop.

In addition, I have been asked to serve as a guest lecturer in at least twenty classes at various educational institutions and programs of all levels, including Harvard University, Yale University, Boston University, Suffolk University, and Northeastern University. I have described those lectures in response to Question 12(d) above.

The following are examples of my pro bono service:

While at Bingham McCutchen, I supervised all of the Summer Associates handling pro bono matters at the Volunteer Lawyers Project. I also volunteered all of my time and services representing the nine individuals filing discrimination complaints against BPD for discriminatory practices involving hair testing. (See *supra* at answer 15(#8)). I also assisted

then-Bingham McCutchen partner Marty Murphy with a matter resulting in a federal jury trial defending an indigent man accused of drug trafficking and firearm offenses.

During my time at the USAO, I was a near-constant volunteer with Discovering Justice's Discovering the Bill of Rights program, which introduced middle school students to the First and Fourth Amendments through experimental learning. (As an Assistant United States Attorney, I was prohibited from performing many other types of pro bono service.)

While at MassDOT, the MBTA, and Massport, I was appointed by Governor Deval Patrick to serve as a Commissioner on the Judicial Nominating Commission for the Commonwealth. During this same time, I also assumed a leadership position within the Massachusetts Black Lawyers Association, ultimately becoming one of the few woman to ever be elected President of the organization.

While I no longer perform pro bono service in the traditional sense, I dedicated my campaign for District Attorney and my subsequent service in this office to uplifting, highlighting, and advocating for disadvantaged, marginalized, and impacted communities in the criminal legal system.
