WIFLE Foundation, Inc. also known as Women in Federal Law Enforcement would like to join our fellow law enforcement organizations in supporting Anne Milgram to lead the Drug Enforcement Administration. As you know the percentage of women in Law Enforcement is at 12% and those figures have not changed since 2007. In the Federal sector the percentage of women have actually decreased from 16% to 13.8%. Research has demonstrated the importance women bring to creating better relationships between law enforcement and the communities they serve.

- Milgram joined the prominent Manhattan District Attorney's Office (1997-2001) following a judicial clerkship for the Honorable Anne E. Thompson of the United States District Court for the District of New Jersey. She later joined the Justice Department's Civil Rights Division, where she served as the Special Litigation Counsel for Human Trafficking and led the Department's human trafficking prosecutions (2001-2005).
- From 2007 2010, Ms. Milgram led a large law enforcement agency as New Jersey's 57th Attorney General where she directed the State Division of Criminal Justice and oversaw 21 prosecutors and nearly 30,000 local law enforcement officers statewide.
- As New Jersey's Attorney General, Ms. Milgram used groundbreaking technology to make
 improvements to the criminal legal system overseeing the change in the Camden Police
 Department. Ms. Milgram used data and analytics to make decisions about how to fight crime and keep
 communities safe. As a result, Camden experienced a reduction in murders by 41% and all crime by
 26%.
